A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EXPLOSION DETECTION TECHNOLOGY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the people of the
- 2 State deserve to live in peace and security, without the public
- 3 safety risks, health hazards, and traumatic impacts of illegal
- 4 gunfire and illegal fireworks use.
- 5 The legislature also finds that new technologies allow law
- 6 enforcement officers to instantly detect and locate the
- 7 geographic origin of explosions caused by gunfire or illegal
- 8 fireworks. According to a police lieutenant in Denver, his
- 9 department's use of this technology allows them to receive
- 10 notification of gunshots within forty seconds and respond to
- 11 within twenty-five feet of an actual crime scene. The
- 12 legislature notes that ShotSpotter is one such product that is
- 13 currently being used by more than ninety cities nationwide.
- 14 The legislature further finds that these technologies were
- 15 originally developed to assist law enforcement in detecting
- 16 gunshots, but may also equip police departments to enforce
- 17 fireworks laws.
