A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii is one of the
- 2 most beautiful places on the planet, with breathtaking
- 3 landscapes, lush tropical forests, and rich ocean resources.
- 4 The State is home to amazing ecosystems that include a unique
- 5 mix of flora and fauna, including dozens of endemic Hawaiian
- 6 birds that can be found nowhere else on earth; approximately one
- 7 thousand four hundred species of native plants, ninety per cent
- 8 of which are endemic to the State; and familiar marine mammals
- 9 that are closely associated with the State, including the
- 10 Hawaiian monk seal and humpback whale.
- 11 The legislature also finds that state residents understand
- 12 the importance of these unique resources and appreciate their
- 13 value. More specifically, residents appreciate the beloved
- 14 native and endemic plants and animals of Hawaii, strongly
- 15 believe that these resources must be preserved for future
- 16 generations, and support opportunities to directly contribute to
- 17 the conservation of these critical resources.

10	SECT	ION 2. Chapter 249, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
11	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated

14	conservat	cion; authorized. (a) Notwithstanding any law to the	
15	contrary,	the director of finance shall issue to any registered	
16	owner of	a motor vehicle, who is a resident of the State and has	
17	completed	the application and paid the required fees, special	
18	number pl	ates that commemorate the importance of forest and	
19	ocean con	servation, for the registered owner's motor vehicle.	
20	(b)	The director of finance of the city and county of	
21	Honolulu	shall establish special number plate designs that	

1	commemora	te the importance of forest and ocean conservation;	
2	provided that the director of finance shall establish two		
3	different designs that commemorate the importance of forest		
4	conservat	ion and that correspond to the two fundraising fee	
5	amounts described in subsection (e), and two different designs		
6	that commemorate the importance of ocean conservation and that		
7	correspon	d to the two fundraising fee amounts described in	
8	subsectio	n (e). Each design shall:	
9	(1)	Contain words or images, or both, that indicate that	
10		the special number plate is being issued to	
11		commemorate the importance of forest or ocean	
12		conservation;	
13	(2)	Be similar in shape and size to the uniform state	
14		number plate prescribed by law; and	
15	(3)	Be readily identifiable and distinguishable under	
16		actual traffic conditions.	
17	The direc	tor of finance of the city and county of Honolulu shall	
18	consult w	rith the directors of finance of the counties of Kauai,	
19	Maui, and	Hawaii; the chiefs of police of the city and county of	
20	<u> Honolulu</u>	and the counties of Kauai, Maui, and Hawaii; and the

3	<u>(c)</u>	Each special number plate design shall not:	
4	(1)	Infringe upon or otherwise violate any trademark,	
5		trade name, service mark, copyright, or other	
6		proprietary or property right;	
7	(2)	Represent any obscene or degrading image, idea, word,	
8		or phrase;	
9	(3)	Advertise or endorse a product, brand, or service that	
10		is provided for sale;	
11	(4)	Promote any religious belief;	
12	(5)	Promote any philosophy based on prejudice or that is	
13		contrary to state civil rights laws; or	
14	(6)	Obstruct the visibility of the number plate's numbers	
15		or letters or any other information that is required	
16		by law to be on a number plate.	
17	<u>(d)</u>	Each special number plate shall be securely fastened	
18	to the mo	tor vehicle in lieu of the uniform state number plate.	
19	<u>(e)</u>	The director of finance shall charge a special number	
20	plate fee	at least equal to the county's cost of providing the	
21	special n	umber plate and administrative costs, if any, plus a	

1	rundraising lee of either \$100 or \$200; provided that the		
2	director	of finance shall issue a separate number plate design	
3	for each fundraising fee amount. The special number plate fee		
4	and fundra	aising fee established by this subsection shall be in	
5	addition	to any other state or county fees collected for a motor	
6	vehicle re	egistration or license plate.	
7	(f) The director of finance shall charge the same		
8	fundraisi	ng fee established pursuant to subsection (e) for the	
9	renewal o	f a special number plate.	
10	(g)	The revenue generated by the fundraising fees	
11	establish	ed pursuant to subsections (e) and (f) shall be	
12	deposited	into the:	
13	(1)	Forest stewardship fund established pursuant to	
14		section 195F-4, if the fundraising fee is for a	
15		special number plate issued to commemorate the	
16		importance of forest conservation; and	
17	(2)	Beach restoration special fund established pursuant to	
18		section 171-156, if the fundraising fee is for a	
19		special number plate issued to commemorate the	
20		importance of ocean conservation; provided that fees	
21		deposited into the beach restoration special fund	

1	pursuant to this paragraph shall be used for beach and
2	nearshore environmental cleanup as authorized by
3	section 171-156(b)(1).
4	(h) The director of finance may revoke all special number
5	plates issued pursuant to this section if the total number of
6	registered owners of motor vehicles that obtain the special
7	number plates is less than one hundred fifty within three years
8	of issuance of the first special number plate.
9	(i) Nothing in this section shall be construed to apply to
10	any plates issued pursuant to section 249-9.2.
11	(j) For the purposes of this section, unless a different
12	meaning appears from the context, "special number plate" means a
13	license plate that is not a uniform state number plate."
14	SECTION 3. Section 171-156, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15	amended to read as follows:
16	"[{]§171-156[}] Beach restoration special fund. (a)
17	There is established in the state treasury a special fund to be
18	designated as the "beach restoration special fund" to carry out
19	the purposes of this part. The following moneys shall be
20	deposited into the beach restoration special fund:

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1	(1)	Proceeds from the lease or development of public
2		coastal lands designated pursuant to a beach
3		restoration plan, subject to the Hawaiian Homes
4		Commission Act of 1920, as amended, and section 5(f)
5		of the Admission Act of 1959;
6	(2)	Proceeds from the lease of public lands pursuant to
7		this part for an existing seawall or revetment;
8	(3)	Proceeds from the fundraising fee charged for special
9		number plates pursuant to section 249- (g)(2);
10	[(3)]	(4) Fines collected for unauthorized shoreline
11		structures on state submerged land or conservation
12		district land;
13	[-(4)-]	(5) Appropriations made by the legislature for
14		deposit into this fund;
15	[(5)]	(6) Donations and contributions made by private
16		individuals or organizations for deposit into this
17		fund;
18	[(6)]	(7) Fees collected for the processing of applications
19		for coastal and beach erosion control projects; and
20	[-(7)-]	(8) Grants provided by governmental agencies or any
21		other source.

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1	(b)	The beach restoration special fund may be used by the
2	departmen	t for one or more of the following purposes:
3	(1)	Planning, designing, development, or implementation of
4		beach restoration projects pursuant to this part[\div
5		and], including beach and nearshore environmental
6		cleanup; and
7	(2)	Providing grants to the counties, nongovernmental
8		organizations, and the University of Hawaii for the
9		restoration of beach lands and for research or
10		engineering studies necessary to support beach
11		restoration projects, subject to this part."
12	SECT	TION 4. Section 195F-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13	amended b	y amending subsection (c) to read as follows:

11	forest	reserves with an emphasis on restoring degraded
12	koa for	ests; and
13	[(iii) developing	[(3) Developing environmental education and
14	trainin	g programs pertaining to sustainable forestry;
15	provided that the	activities described in [clauses (ii) and
16	(iii) may] paragr	aphs (2) and (3) shall not be funded unless the
17	activities descri	bed in approved management plans pertaining to

19	(b) The fun	d-shall consist of moneys received from any
20	public or private	sources.]; provided further that payments
21	shall be made by	the board pursuant to agreements entered into

- 3 (c) The fund shall be held separate and apart from all
- 4 other moneys, funds, and accounts in the state treasury;
- 5 provided that any moneys received from the federal government or
- 6 from private contributions shall be deposited and accounted for
- 7 in accordance with conditions established by the agencies or
- 8 persons from whom the moneys are received.
- 9 (d) Investment earnings credited to the fund shall become
- 10 a part of the assets of the fund. Any balance remaining in the
- 11 fund at the end of any fiscal year shall be carried forward in
- 12 the fund for the next fiscal year."
- 13 SECTION 6. Section 195F-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 14 amended by amending subsection (e) to read as follows:
- "(e) The board shall submit annually a detailed report to
- 16 the governor and legislature that shall:
- 17 (1) Identify management objectives that have been
- completed on private lands resulting from payments
- made pursuant to section $[\frac{195F-4(a)(1)}{2}]$ 195F-4(a) and
- provide an analysis of problems and issues encountered

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		in meeting of failing to meet objectives as set forth
2		in the management plans;
3	(2)	Identify all reforestation, forest management,
4		education, and training objectives that have been
5		completed as a result of any expenditures made
6		pursuant to section 195F-4(a)(2);
7	(3)	Describe the financial condition of the fund,
8		including receipts and expenditures from the previous
9		fiscal year; and
10	(4)	Set forth plans and management objectives for the next
11		fiscal year."
12	SECT	ION 7. Section 249-9.1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13	amended t	o read as follows:
14	"§ 24	9-9.1 Special number plates. In addition to the
15	number pl	ates contracted on behalf of the counties by the
16	director	of finance of the city and county of Honolulu, the
17	director	of finance may provide, upon request, special number
18	plates.	The special number plates shall conform to the
19	requireme	nts provided for the uniform number plates except that
20	the owner	may request the choice and arrangement of letters and
21	numhers	The maximum number of letters and numbers shall be six

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- 1 and only one hyphen will be allowed in addition to and in lieu
- 2 of the six letters and numerals. No other punctuation marks
- 3 shall be allowed. The director of finance shall not issue
- 4 special number plates which have the letter and numeral
- 5 combination of regular plates, are misleading or publicly
- **6** objectionable. The fee for special number plates shall be [\$25]
- 7 \$100 upon initial application and [\$25] \$100 upon each annual
- 8 renewal of the vehicle registration. This fee shall not be
- 9 refundable. Re-application for special number plates must be
- 10 made upon a change in design of regular plates. The director of
- 11 finance may discard and allow for new applications of inactive
- 12 special number plates that have not been assigned or registered
- 13 during the preceding three years. The director of finance shall
- 14 adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 to carry out this section."
- 15 SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 16 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 17 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Report Title:

Counties; Board of Land and Natural Resources; Special Number Plates; Forest Conservation; Ocean Conservation

Description:

Authorizes the issuance of special number plates to support forest conservation and ocean conservation, with proceeds from the program to be used to fund conservation efforts at the State's beaches, nearshore environment, and forests. Increases the initial application and renewal fees for special number plates from \$25 to \$100. (HD1)

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
