## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii is one of the
- 2 most beautiful places on the planet, with breathtaking
- 3 landscapes, lush tropical forests, and rich ocean resources.
- 4 The State is home to amazing ecosystems that include a unique
- 5 mix of flora and fauna, including dozens of endemic Hawaiian
- 6 birds that can be found nowhere else on earth; approximately one
- 7 thousand four hundred species of native plants, ninety per cent
- 8 of which are endemic to the State; and familiar marine mammals
- 9 that are closely associated with the State, including the
- 10 Hawaiian monk seal and humpback whale.
- 11 The legislature also finds that state residents understand
- 12 the importance of these unique resources and appreciate their
- 13 value. More specifically, residents appreciate the beloved
- 14 native and endemic plants and animals of Hawaii, strongly
- 15 believe that these resources must be preserved for future
- 16 generations, and support opportunities to directly contribute to
- 17 the conservation of these critical resources.



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1	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish
2	special number motor vehicle license plates that commemorate the
3	importance of forest and ocean conservation, and to use proceeds
4	from the special number plate program to fund conservation
5	efforts for the State's beaches, nearshore environments, and
6	forests.
7	SECTION 2. Chapter 249, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
9	and to read as follows:
10	"§249- Special number plates for forest and ocean
11	conservation; authorized. (a) Notwithstanding any law to the
12	contrary, the director of finance shall issue to any registered
13	owner of a motor vehicle, who is a resident of the State and has
14	completed the application and paid the required fees, special
15	number plates for the registered owner's motor vehicle
16	commemorating the importance of forest and ocean conservation.
17	(b) The director of finance of the city and county of
18	Honolulu, in consultation with the directors of finance of the
19	counties of Kauai, Maui, and Hawaii, the chiefs of police of the
20	city and county of Honolulu, and the counties of Kauai, Maui,
21	and Hawaii, and the chairperson of the board of land and natural

1	resources	, shall establish special number plate designs that
2	commemora	te the importance of forest and ocean conservation;
3	provided	that the director of finance shall establish two
4	different	designs that commemorate the importance of forest
5	conservat	ion and that correspond to the two fundraising fee
6	amounts d	escribed in subsection (e), and two different designs
7	that comm	emorate the importance of ocean conservation and that
8	correspon	d to the two fundraising fee amounts described in
9	subsection	n (e). Each design shall:
10	(1)	Contain words, images, or both, that indicate the
11		special number plate is issued to commemorate the
12		importance of forest or ocean conservation;
13	(2)	Be similar in shape and size to the uniform state
14		number plate prescribed by law; and
15	(3)	Not obstruct the visibility of the number or letters
16		or any other information that is required by law to be
17		on a number plate and is readily identifiable and
18		distinguishable under actual traffic conditions.
19	(c)	Each special number plate design shall not:

1	(1)	infringe of otherwise violate any trademark, trade
2		name, service mark, copyright, or other proprietary or
3		property right;
4	(2)	Represent any obscene or degrading image, idea, word,
5		or phrase;
6	(3)	Advertise or endorse a product, brand, or service that
7		is provided for sale;
8	(4)	Promote any religious belief; or
9	(5)	Promote any philosophy based on prejudice or that is
10		contrary to state civil rights laws.
11	(d)	Each special number plate shall be securely fastened
12	to the mo	tor vehicle in lieu of the uniform state number plate.
13	<u>(e)</u>	The director of finance shall charge a special number
14	plate fee	at least equal to the county's cost of providing the
15	special n	umber plate and administrative costs, if any, plus a
16	fundraisi	ng fee of either \$100 or \$200; provided that the
17	director	of finance shall issue a separate number plate design
18	for each	fundraising fee amount. The special number plate fee
19	and fundr	aising fee established by this subsection shall be in
20	addition	to any other state or county fees collected for a motor
21	vehicle r	egistration or license plate.

1	<u>(f)</u>	The director of finance shall charge the same
2	fundraisi	ng fee established pursuant to subsection (e), for the
3	renewal of	f a special number plate.
4	<u>(g)</u>	The revenue generated by the fundraising fees shall be
5	deposited	into the:
6	(1)	Forest stewardship fund established pursuant to
7		section 195F-4, if the fundraising fee is for a
8		special number plate issued to commemorate the
9		importance of forest conservation; and
10	(2)	Beach restoration special fund established pursuant to
11		section 171-156, if the fundraising fee is for a
12		special number plate issued to commemorate the
13		importance of ocean conservation. Provided that fees
14		deposited into the beach restoration special fund
15		pursuant to this paragraph shall be used for beach and
16		nearshore environmental cleanup as authorized by
17		section 171-156(b)(1), Hawaii Revised Statutes.
18	(h)	The director of finance may revoke all special number
19	plates is:	sued pursuant to this section if the total number of
20	registere	d owners of motor vehicles that obtain the special

number plates is less than one hundred fifty within three years 1 of issuance of the first special number plate. 2 (i) Nothing in this section shall be construed to apply to 3 4 any plates issued pursuant to section 249-9.2. (j) For the purposes of this section, unless a different 5 meaning appears from the context, "special number plate" means a 6 7 license plate that is not a uniform state number plate." SECTION 3. Section 171-156, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 9 amended to read as follows: 10 "[+] §171-156[+] Beach restoration special fund. (a) 11 There is established in the state treasury a special fund to be designated as the "beach restoration special fund" to carry out 12 13 the purposes of this part. The following moneys shall be 14 deposited into the beach restoration special fund: 15 (1) Proceeds from the lease or development of public coastal lands designated pursuant to a beach 16 17 restoration plan, subject to the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act of 1920, as amended, and section 5(f) 18 19 of the Admission Act of 1959; 20 (2) Proceeds from the lease of public lands pursuant to

this part for an existing seawall or revetment;

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1	(3)	Proceeds from the fundralsing fee charged for special
2		number plates pursuant to section 249- (g)(2);
3	[ <del>(3)</del> ]	(4) Fines collected for unauthorized shoreline
4		structures on state submerged land or conservation
5		district land;
6	[ <del>(4)</del> ]	(5) Appropriations made by the legislature for
7		deposit into this fund;
8	[ <del>(5)</del> ]	(6) Donations and contributions made by private
9		individuals or organizations for deposit into this
10		fund;
11	[ <del>-(6)</del> ]	(7) Fees collected for the processing of applications
12		for coastal and beach erosion control projects; and
13	[ <del>(7)</del> ]	(8) Grants provided by governmental agencies or any
14		other source.
15	(b)	The beach restoration special fund may be used by the
16	departmen	t for one or more of the following purposes:
17	(1)	Planning, designing, development, or implementation of
18		beach restoration projects pursuant to this part;
19		[ <del>and</del> ]
20	(2)	Providing grants to the counties, nongovernmental
21		organizations, and the University of Hawaii for the

1		resto	oration of beach lands and for research or
2		engi	neering studies necessary to support beach
3		resto	oration projects, subject to this part[+]; and
4	<u>(3)</u>	Condi	acting beach and nearshore environmental
5		clear	nups."
6	SECT	ION 4	. Section 195F-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7	amended b	y ame	nding subsection (a) to read as follows:
8	" (a)	The	re is established a special fund within the state
9	treasury	known	as the forest stewardship fund which shall be
10	used as f	ollow	3:
11	(1)	Payme	ents shall be made by the board pursuant to
12		agre	ements entered into with qualified landowners to
13		furt	ner the purposes of this chapter; and
14	(2)	Mone	ys collected from:
15		(A)	The harvest of non-native forest products from
16			forest reserves;
17		(B)	The harvest of native forest products from
18			degraded forests as defined in section 186-5.5,
19			within forest reserves;
20		(C)	The sale of forest products found dead and lying
21			on the ground;

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1	(D) The sale of tree seedlings from state nurseries
2	(E) The sale of any other products or services, or
3	anything of value derived from forest reserves
4	not described above; [ex]
5	(F) The imposition of fines or penalties for
6	violations of this chapter and chapters 183 and
7	185 or any rule adopted thereunder; or
8	(G) Proceeds from the fundraising fee charged for
9	special number plates pursuant to section
10	24- (g) (1),
11	shall be used for:
12	(i) [replanting, Replanting, managing, and
13	maintaining designated timber management
14	areas;
15	(ii) [enhancing] Enhancing the management of
16	public forest reserves with an emphasis on
17	restoring degraded koa forests; and
18	(iii) [developing Developing environmental
19	education and training programs pertaining
20	to sustainable forestry;

1	provided that the activities described in clauses (ii)
2	and (iii) $[may]$ shall not be funded unless the
3	activities described in approved management plans
4	pertaining to clause (i) are adequately funded."
5	SECTION 5. Section 249-9.1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	"§249-9.1 Special number plates. In addition to the
8	number plates contracted on behalf of the counties by the
9	director of finance of the city and county of Honolulu, the
10	director of finance may provide, upon request, special number
11	plates. The special number plates shall conform to the
12	requirements provided for the uniform number plates except that
13	the owner may request the choice and arrangement of letters and
14	numbers. The maximum number of letters and numbers shall be six
15	and only one hyphen will be allowed in addition to and in lieu
16	of the six letters and numerals. No other punctuation marks
17	shall be allowed. The director of finance shall not issue
18	special number plates which have the letter and numeral
19	combination of regular plates, are misleading or publicly
20	objectionable. The fee for special number plates shall be $[\$25]$
21	\$100 upon initial application and [\$25] \$100 upon each annual

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- 1 renewal of the vehicle registration. This fee shall not be
- 2 refundable. Re-application for special number plates must be
- 3 made upon a change in design of regular plates. The director of
- 4 finance may discard and allow for new applications of inactive
- 5 special number plates that have not been assigned or registered
- 6 during the preceding three years. The director of finance shall
- 7 adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 to carry out this section."
- 8 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 9 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 10 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

#### Report Title:

Counties; Board of Land and Natural Resources; Special License Plates; Forest Conservation; Ocean Conservation

#### Description:

Authorizes the issuance of special license plates to support forest conservation and ocean conservation, with proceeds from the program to be used to fund conservation efforts at the State's beaches, nearshore environment, and forests. Increases the initial application and renewal fees for special number plates from \$25 to \$100. (SD1)

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
