A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COFFEE PEST CONTROL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that coffee is one of the 2 largest agricultural crops in the State and is a highly valued 3 commodity in Hawaii's economy. In recent years, the coffee 4 berry borer, a small beetle, has infested coffee crops in the Kona and Kau regions of Hawaii island, and more recently has 5 6 been detected on Oahu, Maui, Kauai, and Lanai. In 2020, coffee 7 leaf rust was discovered for the first time in the State on Maui 8 and Hawaii island. These two pests threaten the viability of 9 the State's entire coffee industry. Efforts to control the 10 coffee berry borer and coffee leaf rust are critical to the 11 coffee industry, and the State must continue to support these 12 efforts.

13 The legislature also finds that application of the organic
14 biological pesticide containing the fungus *Beauveria bassiana* is
15 known to cause high rates of mortality in the coffee berry borer
16 and is a primary method of pest control for the coffee berry
17 borer in other coffee-growing regions of the world. The



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legislature further finds that the combination of a topical
 contact fungicide with a systemic fungicide is the most
 effective control method for coffee leaf rust. Research shows
 that subsidizing the cost of pesticides is an effective and
 necessary incentive to encourage farmers to adopt recommended
 pest management strategies.

Act 105, Session Laws of Hawaii 2014, appropriated funds for the development and implementation of a pesticide subsidy program to assist coffee growers with offsetting the cost of purchasing pesticides containing *Beauveria bassiana*. However, it took longer than anticipated for Act 105 to be implemented, and this assistance only became available from the State at the end of 2016, more than two years later.

Act 152, Session Laws of Hawaii 2015, established a
pesticide subsidy program manager position as a full-time,
temporary position exempt from chapters 76 and 89, Hawaii
Revised Statutes.

18 Act 65, Session Laws of Hawaii 2017, extended the sunset
19 date of the pesticide subsidy program for two years, to June 30,
20 2021, so that the program can remain in effect for the number of
21 years that was intended when Act 105 was passed.

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Act 32, Session Laws of Hawaii 2018, extended the pesticide
 subsidy program manager position, including the exemption from
 chapters 76 and 89, for two years to June 30, 2022, in order to
 process applications for subsidies for costs incurred in the
 final year of the program.


The purpose of this Act is to extend the sunset dates of 6 7 both the pesticide subsidy program and the program manager 8 position, including the position's civil service and collective 9 bargaining laws exemption, for two more years so that the 10 program can remain in effect to assist in responding to the 11 newly discovered coffee leaf rust, continue helping growers 12 manage coffee berry borer, and add control methods for coffee 13 leaf rust as an eligible reimbursable item.

SECTION 2. Act 105, Session Laws of Hawaii 2014, as amended by section 1 of Act 152, Session Laws of Hawaii 2015, as amended by section 2 of Act 65, Session Laws of Hawaii 2017, as amended by section 2 of Act 32, Session Laws of Hawaii 2018, as amended by section 43 of Act 111, Session Laws of Hawaii 2019, is amended as follows:

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1. By amending section 3 to read:



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1	"SECTION 3. (a) There is established in the department of
2	agriculture a pesticide subsidy program to be administered by
3	the department beginning on July 1, 2014, and ending on June 30,
4	[2021.] 2023. The department shall grant subsidies to coffee
5	growers to assist them in offsetting the costs of purchasing any
6	pesticide that is listed by the department pursuant to
7	subsection (f).
8	(b) Applications for subsidies by coffee growers shall be
9	submitted on a form furnished by the department and shall be
10	filed with accompanying documentation of the costs of purchasing
11	the pesticide; provided that:
12	(1) The applicant shall indemnify and hold harmless the
13	State and its officers, agents, and employees from all
14	claims arising out of or resulting from the pesticide
15	purchased; and
16	(2) The department may request an applicant to provide
17	necessary information for the purposes of verifying
18	the size or sale weight, as applicable, and amount of
19	the pesticide purchased.
20	(c) Documentation of pesticide costs, as requested by the
21	department, shall be filed for pesticides purchased within the



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immediate preceding fiscal year of filing and shall be effective
 for pesticide costs incurred after June 30, 2014, and before
 July 1, [2021.] 2023.

(d) Funds shall be disbursed upon approval on an annual
basis by the department to the coffee grower for up to seventyfive per cent of the costs incurred for the purchase of the
pesticide before July 1, 2016, and for up to fifty per cent of
the costs incurred after June 30, 2016, and before July 1,
[2021.] 2023.

10 (e) The department shall aggregate the total subsidy applications pursuant to this section and divide and distribute 11 12 the available subsidy funds on a pro rata basis; provided that 13 no single coffee grower shall receive subsidies that are more 14 than \$600 per year for coffee berry borer control and more than 15 \$600 per year for coffee leaf rust control per acre of land in 16 coffee production; provided further that no single coffee grower 17 shall receive subsidies that are more than \$9,000 per year[-]; 18 provided further that no single coffee grower shall receive 19 subsidies that total more than \$6,000 per year for the period 20 after June 30, 2018, and before July 1, 2021[+]; and provided 21 further that no single coffee grower shall receive subsidies



1 that total more than \$12,000 per year for the period after June 2 30, 2021, and before July 1, 2023. 3 The department shall establish a list of pesticides (f) 4 that are registered with the Environmental Protection Agency and 5 are licensed with the State that contain Beauveria bassiana, a fungus known to eradicate the coffee berry borer, as an active 6 7 ingredient. The department shall also establish a list of 8 pesticides that are registered with the United States 9 Environmental Protection Agency and are licensed with the State 10 that are contact and systemic fungicides, which in combination 11 are effective against coffee leaf rust. 12 (g) There is established within the department a pesticide 13 subsidy program manager position, which shall be a full-time, temporary position exempt from chapters 76 and 89, Hawaii 14 Revised Statutes. The pesticide subsidy program manager shall 15 possess a requisite level of knowledge and expertise in the area 16 of program management necessary to carry out the duties of the 17 The pesticide subsidy program manager shall: 18 position. (1) Facilitate the efficient division and distribution of 19 available subsidy funds; and 20



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1 (2) Manage the day-to-day coordination for the pesticide 2 subsidy program. 3 The pesticide subsidy program manager shall receive a 4 salary of not more than \$50,000 per year. The pesticide subsidy 5 program manager position, including the position's exemption 6 from chapters 76 and 89, Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall expire 7 on June 30, [2022.] 2024. 8 (h) Not later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of [2021,] 2023, the department shall submit 9 10 a report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the legislature on the results of the 11 subsidy program and whether the program should be allowed to 12

13 expire or be extended, and if extended, with or without 14 modification.

(i) Actions taken by the department pursuant to this
section shall be exempt from the rulemaking requirements of
section 91-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes."

Description:

Provides that no single coffee grower shall receive more than \$6,000 for each pest per year in subsidies between 06/30/2021, and 07/01/2023.
