A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COMMUNITY HEALTH WORKERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that during the
- 2 coronavirus disease-19 (COVID-19) pandemic, many rural areas in
- 3 the State of Hawaii were disconnected and unable to receive
- 4 adequate healthcare services. As rural communities struggled
- 5 with connectivity, transportation, and financial obligations,
- 6 community health workers provided a critical lifeline to
- 7 ensuring its residents healthcare needs are met. With the
- 8 rapidly changing global health pandemic, rural communities that
- 9 have limited healthcare services are at a greater risk of
- 10 receiving access to adequate, timely and life-saving healthcare
- 11 services.
- 12 Many families living in rural areas comprise diverse
- 13 communities, including low-income, underserved rural areas, all
- 14 ethnicities, children, adults, families, elderly individuals,
- 15 uninsured individuals, homeless individuals, immigrants and
- 16 migrant workers. Many of these families face language and

- 1 cultural barriers that require further assistance and technology
- 2 in the community.
- 3 The legislature further finds that with deepening food
- 4 insecurity, increasing housing instability, slow job recovery,
- 5 and the replacement of many in-person health services with
- 6 telehealth services, the need for community health workers to
- 7 bridge communities and systems of care is greater than ever.
- 8 Increasing the number of community healthcare workers and
- 9 standardizing their certification and training will help address
- 10 these issues.
- 11 The purpose of this Act is to:
- 12 (1) Establish a certification process, an oversight board,
- and a reimbursement process for services performed by
- 14 community health workers to help address the social
- 15 determinants of poor health that disproportionately
- 16 affect low-income, minority populations and that are
- magnified during times of crisis; and
- 18 (2) Establish a task force to plan the certification and
- 19 training process.
- 20 SECTION 2. The department of health shall establish a
- 21 certification process for community health workers, including a

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- 2 health workers, oversight board, and reimbursement process for
- 3 services provided by community health workers. The department
- 4 of health shall consult with other departments, agencies, and
- 5 community stakeholders for the establishment of the
- 6 certification process, oversight board, and reimbursement
- 7 process for service. In creating the certification process, the
- 8 department of health shall consider:
- 9 (1) A certification process with at least two tiers of
 10 community health workers, which should be designated
- based on work and education experience;
- 12 (2) An oversight body to oversee community health workers
- and provide input to the legislature;
- 14 (3) A retroactive certification process for community
- 15 health workers who have completed at least eighty
- hours of training and two thousand hours of experience
- 17 prior to the establishment of a certification program;
- 18 and
- 19 (4) Multiple sources of payment to community health
- workers.

1	SECT	ION 3. In developing competency standards for
2	certifica	tion of community health workers, the department of
3	health sh	all consider the following core competencies:
4	(1)	Effective oral and written communication skills;
5	(2)	Cultural familiarity and competency;
6	(3)	Knowledge of local resources and health care system
7		navigation;
8	(4)	Advocacy and community capacity building skills;
9	(5)	Care coordination skills;
10	(6)	Ability to teach skills to promote healthy behavior
11		change;
12	(7)	Knowledge of outreach methods and strategies;
13	(8)	Ability to address needs and identify resources;
14	(9)	Understanding of public health concepts and health
15		literacy;
16	(10)	Understanding of ethics and confidentiality issues;
17		and
18	(11)	Ability to use and understand health information
19		technology.

I	SECT	ION 4. (a) The department of health shall establish a
2	community	health worker certification task force to plan the
3	certifica	tion and training process required by this Act.
4	(b)	The following individuals shall serve as the members
5	of the ta	sk force:
6	(1)	The director of health or the director's designee, who
7		shall serve as the chairperson of the task force;
8	(2)	One community health worker from each county, to be
9		designated by the director of health;
10	(3)	A representative from the University of Hawaii system;
11	(4)	A representative from the University of Hawaii office
12		of public health studies;
13	(5)	A representative from the Hawaii public health
14		institute;
15	(6)	A representative from the Hawaii public housing
16		authority;
17	(7)	A representative from the department of human services
18		med-QUEST division;
19	(8)	A representative from the Hawaii health systems
20		corporation;

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1	(9)	A representative from the University of Hawaii west
2		Oahu; and
3	(10)	A representative from the University of Hawaii school
4		of nursing and dental hygiene.
5	(c)	The task force shall submit a report detailing the
6	status of	the certification and training process for community
7	health wo	rkers required by this Act, including any proposed
8	legislati	on, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
9	to the co	nvening of the regular session of 2022.
10	SECT	TON 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
