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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO A BROADBAND AND DIGITAL EQUITY OFFICE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
2	adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
3	as follows:
4	"CHAPTER
5	HAWAII BROADBAND AND DIGITAL EQUITY OFFICE
6	§ -1 Definitions. As used in this chapter:
7	"Broadband" means high-speed internet access that is always
8	on, including mobile and fixed technologies.
9	"Department" means the department of business, economic
10	development, and tourism.
11	"Digital equity" means a condition in which all individuals
12	and communities have the information technology capacity needed
13	for full participation in society, democracy, and the economy.
14	"Office" means the Hawaii broadband and digital equity
15	office.
16	§ -2 Hawaii broadband and digital equity office;
17	establishment; state broadband strategy coordinator; staff. (a)



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There is established the Hawaii broadband and digital equity
 office within the department of business, economic development,
 and tourism.

4 (b) The director of business, economic development, and
5 tourism shall appoint a state broadband coordinator, who shall
6 be exempt from chapter 76, to head the office.

7 § -3 Hawaii broadband and digital equity office; duties.
8 In furtherance of the State's objectives and policies for the
9 economy pursuant to section 226-10.5, the office shall:

10 (1) Develop and implement specific strategies and plans to
11 aggressively increase broadband affordability,
12 penetration, and competitive availability in the
13 State;

14 (2) Support the efforts of both public and private
15 entities in the State to enhance or facilitate the
16 deployment of and access to competitively priced,
17 advanced electronic communications services, including
18 broadband and its products and services and internet
19 access services of general application throughout the
20 State;



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1	(3)	Promote the landing of trans-Pacific submarine cable,
2		including the development of a shared access cable
3		station and associated terrestrial connectivity to
4		reduce barriers to fiber landing in Hawaii;
5	(4)	Promote, advocate, and facilitate the implementation
6		of the findings and recommendations of the Hawaii
7		broadband task force established by Act 2, First
8		Special Session Laws of Hawaii 2007;
9	(5)	Support the findings of the community-based Broadband
10		Hui as reflected in its digital equity declaration;
11	(6)	Administer grant programs in support of broadband
12		infrastructure, innovation, and the digital economy;
13	(7)	Actively seek out funding from public and private
14		sources in furtherance of the office's duties pursuant
15		to this section; and
16	(8)	Provide a repository, aggregation point, and
17		governance framework for broadband mapping and digital
18		equity data from various sources, including digital
19		literacy, telehealth, distance education, remote work,
20		internet accessibility, and service coverage to

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1			support mapping, reporting, infrastructure deployment,
2			and data-driven policy.
3		S	-4 Broadband planning and coordination; cooperation.
4	(a)	The	office shall:
5		(1)	Seek input and the widest possible cooperation from
6			public and private agencies and individuals to achieve
7			the purposes of this chapter;
8		(2)	Work closely with and assist the counties in the
9			promotion of coordinated state and county broadband
10			planning;
11		(3)	Encourage every state department, county agency, and
12			other public or private agencies and individuals
13			involved in broadband programs to participate in the
14			activities of the office and incorporate, to the
15			extent feasible, the ideas and suggestions of the
16			participants in the office's comprehensive planning
17			goals;
18		(4)	Monitor the broadband-based development efforts of
19			other states and nations in areas such as business,
20			education, and health;

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1	(5)	Advise the department on other states' best practices
2		involving remote work promotion and policies and
3		strategies related to making affordable broadband
4		services available to every home and business in the
5		State;
6	(6)	Monitor broadband-related activities at the federal
7		level;
8	(7)	Encourage public-private partnerships to increase the
9		deployment and adoption of broadband services and
10		applications;
11	(8)	Monitor regulatory and policy changes for potential
12		impact on broadband deployment and sustainability in
13		the State; and
14	(9)	Advise the director of business, economic development,
15		and tourism on broadband deployment.
16	(b)	Nothing in this section shall be construed to
17	delegate,	or detract in any way from, the functions, powers, and
18	duties co:	nferred by law or rule on any department or agency of
19	the State	or county."
20	SECT	ION 2. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
