A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TUITION WAIVERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the authority of
granting tuition waivers by the University of Hawaii system,
including its community colleges, is a matter of statewide
concern.

5 The purpose of this Act is to require the University of 6 Hawaii system and its community colleges to waive tuition for 7 the dependent children of disabled veterans, or active or 8 reserve members of the armed forces who were killed in action, 9 subject to certain requirements.

SECTION 2. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new section to part II to be appropriately designated and to read as follows:

13"§304A-Tuition waivers; children of eligible veterans.14(a)The University of Hawaii, including its community colleges,

15 shall waive tuition for any qualified student who demonstrates

- 17 (1) A disabled veteran;

14	at a University of Hawaii campus.	
15	"Disa	bled veteran" means a veteran who is determined by the
16	United Sta	tes Department of Veterans Affairs to have a service-
17	connected one hundred per cent disability rating for	
18	compensation or a service-connected disability rating of one	
19	hundred per cent due to the physical or psychological injuries	
20	received w	hile on duty with the armed forces of the United

21 States.

2	or national guard member who was an active or reserve member of		
3	the United states military or naval forces, or a national guard		
4	member called to active duty, who served in the active federal		
5	service under title 10 or title 32 of the United States Code, in		
6	a war or conflict fought on foreign soil, in international		
7	waters, or in another location in support of those serving on		
8	foreign soil or in international waters.		
9	"Qualified student" means a student under the age of		
10	twenty-four.		
11	(c) The board of regents may adopt rules pursuant to		
12	chapter 91 to implement this section."		
13	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.		
14	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
