SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE FORMATION OF A WORKING GROUP TO EXAMINE THE GOVERNANCE AND MAINTENANCE OF SHARED AREAS IN NON-PLANNED COMMUNITY SUBDIVISIONS.

WHEREAS, in Hawaii, the governance and maintenance of 1 2 common areas in condominium associations are governed by section 514B, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and the governance and 3 maintenance of common areas in planned community associations 4 5 are governed by section 412J, Hawaii Revised Statutes; and 6 7 WHEREAS, there is a lack of statutory guidance on the rights and responsibilities of homeowners or entities on the 8 governance and maintenance of shared areas, such as private 9 roads, recreational facilities, mailboxes, and infrastructure, 10 of non-planned community subdivisions that were created prior to 11 statehood; and 12 13 WHEREAS, the failures of these pre-statehood, non-planned 14 community subdivisions to maintain these shared areas negatively 15 impacts the public, like the delayed arrival of emergency 16 17 response vehicles due to unmaintained roads or mailed prescriptions of essential medications due to lack of mail 18 19 delivery; and 20 21 WHEREAS, though the Hawaii Supreme Court held in Paradise 22 Hui Hanalike v. Hawaiian Paradise Park Corporation, 66 Haw. 362, 662 P.2d 211 (1983), that landowners have a duty to contribute 23 to the maintenance of private roads that abut the landowners' 24 property even without any recorded instrument stating covenants 25 and declarations, yet there still are no formal procedures nor 26 rules on the collection and expenditure of these contributions; 27 28 and 29 30 WHEREAS, the lack of quidance regarding the shared areas of nonplanned community subdivisions result in the constant need 31 for homeowners and entities of these nonplanned community 32



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1 subdivisions to litigate to resolve issues related to the governance and maintenance of shared areas, such as voting 2 rights, use of collected contributions, and authority to audit; 3 4 and 5 WHEREAS, it is in the public interest to establish a 6 procedure for the governance and maintenance of the shared areas 7 8 within non-planned community subdivisions; now, therefore, 9 10 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, the 11 House of Representatives concurring, that a working group be 12 formed to examine the governance and maintenance of shared 13 14 spaces, improvements, and infrastructure in non-planned community subdivisions; and 15 16 17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested 18 to: 19 20 (1) Examine any guidance on the rights and responsibilities of homeowners of a non-planned 21 community subdivision regarding the governance and 22 maintenance of its shared areas, including but not 23 limited to any agreements, leases, or other contracts 24 under which the entities have any obligation or 25 26 responsibility; 27 Examine any guidance on the rights and 28 (2) responsibilities of shared management and governance 29 entities of a non-planned community subdivision 30 31 regarding the governance and maintenance of its shared areas, including but not limited to any agreements, 32 33 leases, or other contracts under which the entities have any obligation or responsibility; 34 35 Examine the various forms of regulation and 36 (3) 37 governance, including any statutory frameworks, oversight agencies, and related programs over the 38 39 shared areas of non-planned community subdivisions in other jurisdictions, including but not limited to 40 voluntary homeowners' associations; 41 42

10 11 12 13 14 15 16 17	(5)	Gather information on the costs, including the potential budget, assessments, shared area maintenance fees, reserve accounts for expenditures and capital maintenance, and any cost-savings to the creation of an entity that governs and/or maintains the shared areas in the non-planned community subdivisions in the State; and
18 19 20 21 22	(6)	Review pertinent resources, including prior state legislation, reports, and studies regarding the governance and/or maintenance of shared areas in non- planned community subdivisions; and
23 24 25	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested to be comprised of the following members or their designees:	
26 27 28 29	(1)	A member of the House of Representatives representing an affected district to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;
30 31 32	(2)	A member of the Senate representing an affected district to be appointed by Senate President;
33 34 35	(3)	The President of the Hawaii State Association of Parliamentarians;
36 37 38	(4)	The President of the Hawaii Council of Community Associations; and
39 40 41 42	(5)	The Chairperson of the Community Associations Institute, Hawaii Chapter, Legislative Action Committee; and

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1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is also 2 requested to consist of an additional member with expertise in 3 4 mediating issues related to non-planned community subdivisions, 5 such as a trained or certified mediator from the Ku'ikahi Mediation Center or another similar organization that 6 7 facilitates or practices alternative dispute resolution; and 8 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group should serve 10 without compensation; and 11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested 12 to submit a report of its findings and recommendations, 13 including any proposed legislation, regarding the governance and 14 maintenance of shared areas in non-planned community 15 16 subdivisions, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2022; and 17 18 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group should cease to exist on December 31, 2022; and 20 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 22 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the President of the 23 Hawaii State Association of Parliamentarians; President of the 24 Hawaii Council of Community Associations; and Chairperson of the 25 Community Associations Institute, Hawaii Chapter, Legislative 26 27 Action Committee. 28 29 30 OFFERED BY:

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
