SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE CONVENING OF A CREATIVE RESURGENCE TASK FORCE TO BUILD AND FOSTER CREATIVITY AND INNOVATION THROUGH THE ARTS, CULTURE, AND HUMANITIES.

1 WHEREAS, the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic 2 has had a devastating impact on the nation's creative economy, 3 with many in the art, music, theater, dance, photography, 4 fashion design, architecture, film, and publishing industries 5 suffering immense losses in sales of goods and services, 6 employment, and earnings; and

8 WHEREAS, not only have those in the creative industries and 9 creative occupations suffered disproportionately due to the 10 COVID-19 pandemic, but creativity has been diminished in schools 11 and universities, with students, educators, and artists being 12 unable to gather, perform, hold art and cultural events, and 13 pursue their studies, which has further led to significant 14 losses in arts education and the humanities; and 15

16 WHEREAS, creative persons are fundamental to society and 17 essential to a robust economy and, particularly during the 18 COVID-19 pandemic, have kept people grounded and inspired 19 optimism, thus helping people find their way through chaos and 20 uncertainty and heal; and

WHEREAS, creative persons also embrace new ideas and possibilities, inspire collective thinking, and contribute to a better understanding of the world and among people; and

26 WHEREAS, the arts and humanities, whether through history, 27 philosophy and religion, modern and ancient languages and 28 literatures, fine and performing arts, media and cultural 29 studies, or other fields, are sources of vast creativity, 30 innovation, and learning; and

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1 WHEREAS, a broad-based effort by the public and private 2 sectors, arts and cultural organizations, economic development groups, and the community is needed to build and foster 3 4 creativity in the State; and 5 WHEREAS, public funding for the arts, humanities, and other 6 7 creative art forms leads to a high return on investment that 8 benefits every Hawaii resident in communities throughout the 9 State; and 10 WHEREAS, those in creative industries, creative 11 12 occupations, and creative fields of study contribute to the State's and nation's economies and well-being through 13 innovation, inspiration, and opportunities for growth; now, 14 therefore, 15 16 17 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 18 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, the House of Representatives concurring, that a creative resurgence 19 20 task force be convened to build and foster creativity and innovation through the arts, culture, and humanities in the 21 22 State; and 23 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the creative resurgence task 25 force is requested to: 26 27 (1) Examine and determine measures that can be implemented 28 to: 29 (A) Protect the tax-exempt status of creative and 30 31 cultural nonprofit organizations; 32 (B) 33 Support tax policies that increase charitable 34 support for the creative sector; 35 Repeal the monetary cap on charitable donation (C) 36 37 deductions from the state income tax; 38 39 (D) Increase the people's access to the arts, creative sector, and humanities through 40 41 education, training, and workforce opportunities; 42 and
