SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE STATE, CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU, AND EWA BEACH COMMUNITY TO ADDRESS THE ISSUE OF FERAL CATS IN THE EWA BEACH AREA.

WHEREAS, feral cat colonies are a persistent problem across 1 2 the island of Oahu; and 3 WHEREAS, feral cats prey on native birds and insects; and 4 5 WHEREAS, according to the International Union for the 6 Conservation of Nature, feral cats are listed among the most 7 harmful invasive species globally; and 8 9 WHEREAS, feral cats are hosts to vectors for toxoplasmosis, 10 a parasitic infection that is an identified threat to endangered 11 12 native species, including the Hawaiian goose, known as the nene; the Hawaiian crow, known as the alala; and the Hawaiian monk 13 seal; and 14 15 WHEREAS, toxoplasmosis also poses a potentially fatal 16 health risk to children and adults, especially those who enjoy 17 recreational activity at park spaces located near feral cat 18 colonies and the Ke Aina Kai playground; and 19 20 WHEREAS, any ongoing attempts to reduce or eliminate feral 21 cat colonies on the island of Oahu have proven unsuccessful; and 22 23 WHEREAS, individuals across the island of Oahu trespass on 24 private properties to feed feral cats, thereby contributing to 25 26 the persistence of feral cats on the island; and 27 WHEREAS, the residents of Mariners Place Townhomes, the 28 only residential community that shares a property line with the 29 Ewa Beach Shopping Center, have been plaqued by feral cats which 30 roam the community urinating and defecating around homes, 31 leaving strong odors and damaging automobile paint and window 32 screens; now, therefore, 33 34

1 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, 2 that the State; City and County of Honolulu; and Ewa Beach 3 community, including residents, community organizations, and 4 property owners and managers, address the ongoing issue of feral 5 cats in the Ewa Beach area; and 6

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawaiian Humane Society is 8 requested to collaborate with other animal rights groups and 9 private property owners and managers, including the management 10 company that oversees the Ewa Beach Shopping Center, as 11 necessary to eliminate or relocate the feral cat colony located 12 at the shopping center; and 13

15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Ewa Beach Shopping Center property management company, or its representative, is requested 16 to provide regular updates to the Ewa Beach Neighborhood Board 17 on the company's progress in addressing the feral cat colony 18 located at the shopping center; and 19

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 21 Resolution be transmitted to the Mayor of the City and County of 22 Honolulu; Honolulu City Council; President and Chief Executive 23 Officer of the Hawaiian Humane Society; and Property Manager of 24 the Ewa Beach Shopping Center. 25
