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## SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE GOVERNOR TO CREATE A TASK FORCE TO DEVELOP RECOMMENDATIONS TO ENFORCE THE SUPPLEMENTAL EMERGENCY PROCLAMATIONS TO MITIGATE THE FURTHER SPREAD OF THE CORONAVIRUS DISEASE 2019 IN HAWAII.

WHEREAS, the global coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) 1 2 pandemic has created great challenges to the State's health, economy, and way of life; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, the Governor and mayors have exercised their emergency powers under chapter 127A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to 6 7 impose rules to control the spread of COVID-19; and 8 9 WHEREAS, section 127A-29, Hawaii Revised Statutes, only 10 provides the Governor and county mayors the ability to establish misdemeanor offenses through rulemaking during emergency 11 periods, putting a heavy burden upon the criminal justice system 12 to process these cases expeditiously to provide for meaningful 13 and effective enforcement; and 14 15 WHEREAS, the ability to enforce emergency rules is 16 essential to control the spread of COVID-19, protect the health 17 18 and safety of the community, manage medical resources, and restart the economy; and 19 20 21 WHEREAS, the Governor has issued supplemental emergency 22 proclamations to mitigate the further spread of COVID-19 by ordering residents and visitors to a mandatory fourteen-day 23 24 self-quarantine for all arrivals at state airports from the continental United States and international destinations; and 25 26 WHEREAS, on November 23, 2020, the Governor signed the 27 sixteenth COVID-19 emergency proclamation requiring all 28 29 transpacific travelers to Hawaii to have a negative test result from a trusted travel partner within three days before their 30 departure to bypass the fourteen-day quarantine; and 31 32



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WHEREAS, the self-quarantine mandate was meant to contain 1 the spread of COVID-19 by restricting the mobility of those who 2 3 travel to Hawaii during the period they might be contagious; and 4 WHEREAS, the State and counties have also imposed emergency 5 6 orders calling for individuals to stay at their place of residence, maintain physical distancing of at least six feet 7 from any other person, limit or prohibit social gatherings, and 8 9 wear face coverings while in public spaces; and 10 WHEREAS, it is a monumental effort to keep track of 11 everyone who should be in quarantine and it involves a hui of 12 law enforcement agencies, representatives of Hawaii's visitor 13 14 industry, state transportation workers, and the general 15 community; and 16 17 WHEREAS, enforcement has been largely reactive, dependent on reports and complaints from the public, social media, and 18 19 interested community groups; and 20 WHEREAS, enforcements are largely on an "honor system", 21 dependent on the deterrent effect of potential penalties and the 22 individual's tolerance for risk; and 23 24 25 WHEREAS; despite the enactment of emergency orders, residents and visitors continue to violate these orders; county 26 policy departments have issued tens of thousands of citations 27 28 for violations of emergency proclamations and orders that must be processed through the court system, thereby inundating the 29 courts, which are already faced with operational complications 30 caused by the COVID-19 pandemic; and 31 32 33 WHEREAS, the state and county law enforcement agencies must be able to provide for meaningful and effective enforcement by 34 vigilantly policing violations to prevent the spread of COVID-19 35 36 throughout the State; now, therefore, 37 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 38 39 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, that the Governor is urged to create a task force to develop 40 recommendations on the roles and responsibilities of the 41 Department of the Attorney General and the state and county law 42
