SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE AUDITOR TO ASSESS THE SOCIAL AND FINANCIAL EFFECTS OF MANDATING COVERAGE OF ANNUAL MENTAL HEALTH SCREENING.

1 WHEREAS, according to the National Institute for Mental Health, in 2019, approximately 51,500,000, or eighteen percent, 2 3 of adults in the United States experiences a mental illness or 4 disorder; and 5 WHEREAS, only forty-four percent of those individuals 6 7 received mental health services for their mental illness; and 8 9 WHEREAS, mental health issues are closely tied to physical health issues such as increased occurrences of chronic diseases 10 such as cardiovascular disease, diabetes, obesity, asthma, 11 12 epilepsy, and cancer; and 13 WHEREAS, mental health issues cost the United States 14 15 economy close to \$200,000,000,000 in lost wages in addition to \$100,000,000,000 in healthcare costs; and 16 17 WHEREAS, suicide is the tenth leading cause of death in the 18 19 United States, costing approximately \$51,000,000,000 each year; and 20 21 WHEREAS, S.B. No. 728, Regular Session of 2021, would 22 23 require health insurers and similar entities that provide coverage for health care to provide coverage for annual mental 24 25 health screenings; and 26 27 WHEREAS, pursuant to section 23-51, Hawaii Revised Statutes, before any legislative measure that mandates health 28 29 insurance coverage for specific health services, specific diseases, or certain providers of health care services as part 30 of individual or group health insurance policies, can be 31 considered, a concurrent resolution shall be passed that 32 designates a specific legislative bill for the Auditor to review 33 34 and on which to prepare a report for submission to the Legislature that assesses both the social and financial effects 35



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of the proposed mandated coverage under that legislative bill; 1 now, therefore, 2 3 4 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, 5 that the Auditor is requested to conduct an assessment, pursuant 6 to sections 23-51 and 23-52, Hawaii Revised Statutes, of the 7 social and financial effects of mandating health care coverage 8 9 of annual mental health screenings, as provided in S.B. No. 728, 10 Regular Session of 2021; and 11 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is requested to submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including 13 14 any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 15 2022; and 16 17 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 19 Resolution be transmitted to the Auditor and Insurance Commissioner. 20 21 22 23 OFFERED BY: Stol
