SENATE RESOLUTION

RECOGNIZING THE SEVENTY-FIFTH ANNIVERSARY OF DIPLOMATIC RELATIONS BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA AND THE REPUBLIC OF THE PHILIPPINES.

1	WHEREAS, the Filipino-American community is among the
2	largest Asian-American and Pacific Islander groups in the United
3	States of America; and
4	
5	WHEREAS, Filipino-Americans have helped shape the history
6	of the State and have contributed to the development of Hawaii
7	from the arrival of the first fifteen Filipino plantation
8	workers on December 20, 1906, up to the present; and
9	
10	WHEREAS, individuals of Filipino ethnicity in Hawaii make
11	up the largest portion of the State's population; and
12	
13	WHEREAS, Filipinos have a long-standing history of serving
14	in the Armed Forces of the United States, with many having
15	received the Congressional Medal of Honor, and continue to
16	demonstrate a sense of patriotism and honor in the Armed Forces;

19	WHEREAS, strong ties of friendship and cooperation link the
20	peoples of Hawaii and the Philippines, demonstrated by the
21	existence of economic and people-to-people exchanges as well as
22	the large number of sister city relationships between the cities and counties of Hawaii and cities and municipalities of the

of America and the Republic of the Philippines on July 4, 2021; 1 2 and 3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this body is committed to 4 exploring opportunities for mutually beneficial cooperation 5 between the people of Hawaii and the Philippines; and 6 7 8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this body urges the Philippine Consulate General in Honolulu to continue to promote Filipino-9 American culture and traditions in keeping with the long history 10 shared between Hawaii and the Philippines; and 11 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this body renews its support 13 for the democratic institutions and processes established in the 14 Philippines and their commitment to the preservation of and 15 respect for human rights and dignity; and 16 17 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 19 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor and Philippine Consulate General in Honolulu. 20
