SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE HAWAII HEALTH SYSTEMS CORPORATION AND THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO CONVENE A TASK FORCE TO DEVELOP BETTER MISSION-DRIVEN HIRING AND TRAINING OF CULTURALLY-ACCEPTED INTERPRETERS EMPLOYED AT HAWAII HEALTH SYSTEMS FACILITIES AND TO CREATE CULTURALLY-ACCEPTED EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS ON PREVENTATIVE CARE AND EARLY INTERVENTION TO ASSIST NON-ENGLISH SPEAKING POPULATIONS SEEKING CARE AT HAWAII HEALTH SYSTEMS CORPORATION FACILITIES.

WHEREAS, the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation (HHSC) 1 provides high quality health care services to residents and 2 visitors throughout the State and serves as a vital component of 3 4 Hawai'i's system of health care; and 5 WHEREAS, HHSC consists of a network of hospitals and 6 clinics, some of which are located in remote, rural, and low-7 8 populated areas; and 9 WHEREAS, HHSC facilities provide safety-net services for 10 neighbor island acute care and for long-term care in the State 11 as they serve all people, regardless of whether an individual 12 has health insurance or the ability to pay for the health care 13 service they receive; and 14 15 WHEREAS, HHSC's mission is to provide accessible, high 16 quality, cost-effective services that address the health care 17 needs of Hawai'i's unique island communities; and 18 19 WHEREAS, HHSC's vision is to be recognized as a progressive 20 model for an accessible, integrated, patient-centered, and 21 22 fiscally responsible health care system focused on assuring high quality care to improve the health of Hawai'i's underserved 23 communities; and 24 25 WHEREAS, HHSC facilities comply with applicable federal, 26 state, and local civil rights laws and do not discriminate on 27



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the basis of race, color, ancestry, national origin, religion, 1 2 age, disability, sex, sexual orientation, or marital status; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the unique island populations served by the HHSC speak a wide range of languages in their homes other than 5 English, including but not limited to Burmese, Cambodian, 6 7 Chinese (Simplified and Traditional), Chuukese, Hawaiian, 8 Ilocano, Japanese, Korean, Kosraean, Lao, Marshallese, Pohnpeian, Samoan, Spanish, Tagalog, Thai, Tongan, and 9 10 Vietnamese; and 11 12 WHEREAS, members of Hawai'i's unique non-English speaking 13 populations are often reluctant and intimidated to seek medical 14 care due to the lack of properly trained interpreters in HHSC 15 medical facilities who are able to assist those seeking medical 16 care because of language and cultural barriers; now, therefore, 17 18 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 19 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, that the Hawaii Health Services Corporation and the Department 20 of Health are requested to convene a task force to facilitate 21 22 improved, mission-driven hiring and training of culturallyaccepted interpreters and to create culturally-accepted 23 24 educational materials on preventative care and early 25 intervention to assist non-English speaking populations seeking 26 care at Hawaii Health Systems Corporation facilities; and 27 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that it is urged that the task force 29 include the following as members: 30 (1)The Regional Chief Executive Officer of the East 31 32 Hawaii Region of Hawaii Health Systems Corporation, to 33 serve as chairperson; 34 (2) 35 The Director of Health, or the Director's designee; 36 (3) 37 One representative from the Office of Language Access; 38 39 (4) Two members of the Senate, to be appointed by the President of the Senate; 40 41
