SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE CONVENING OF A CREATIVE RESURGENCE TASK FORCE TO BUILD AND FOSTER CREATIVITY AND INNOVATION THROUGH THE ARTS, CULTURE, AND HUMANITIES.

WHEREAS, the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic has had a devastating impact on the nation's creative economy, with many in the art, music, theater, dance, photography, fashion design, architecture, film, and publishing industries suffering immense losses in sales of goods and services, employment, and earnings; and

WHEREAS, not only have those in the creative industries and creative occupations suffered disproportionately due to the COVID-19 pandemic, but creativity has been diminished in schools and universities, with students, educators, and artists being unable to gather, perform, hold art and cultural events, and pursue their studies, which has further led to significant losses in arts education and the humanities; and

WHEREAS, creative persons are fundamental to society and essential to a robust economy and, particularly during the COVID-19 pandemic, have kept people grounded and inspired optimism, thus helping people find their way through chaos and uncertainty and heal; and

WHEREAS, creative persons also embrace new ideas and possibilities, inspire collective thinking, and contribute to a better understanding of the world and among people; and

WHEREAS, the arts and humanities, whether through history, philosophy and religion, modern and ancient languages and literatures, fine and performing arts, media and cultural studies, or other fields, are sources of vast creativity, innovation, and learning; and

WHEREAS, a broad-based effort by the public and private sectors, arts and cultural organizations, economic development

groups, and the community is needed to build and foster creativity in the State; and
