SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO CONVENE A WORKING GROUP TO CREATE A MODEL STATEWIDE SCHOOL POLICY ON STUDENT SUICIDE PREVENTION, INTERVENTION, AND POSTVENTION IN GRADES K-12.

1 2 3 4 5	WHEREAS, the Department of Health, in its Hawaii Sexual and Gender Minority Health Report (2017) and Hawaii Sexual and Gender Minority Report 2018: A Focus on Transgender Youth, found that:	
6 7 8 9 10	(1)	Lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and questioning youth are more likely than heterosexual youth to experience suicidal ideation as a result of minority stress;
11 12 13 14 15	(2)	Lesbian, gay, bisexual, and questioning youth are significantly more likely to have engaged in self- injury, considered suicide, made a suicide plan, and attempted suicide than heterosexual youth;
16 17 18 19	(3)	The prevalence of lesbian, gay, and bisexual youth who report that they have considered and attempted suicide is also significantly higher than questioning youth;
20 21 22 23	(4)	Transgender youth are around three times more likely to consider suicide and make a suicide plan than cisgender youth; and
24 25 26 27	(5)	Half of transgender youth reported attempting suicide one or more times, which is nearly seven times higher than cisgender youth; and
28 29 30 31	daily bas	EAS, school personnel who interact with students on a is are essential gatekeepers for recognizing warning suicide and making the appropriate referrals for help;

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1 WHEREAS, E Ola Hou Prevent Suicide Maui County Task Force has been working with the Department of Education to provide 2 mandated suicide prevention training for all school employees; 3 now, therefore 4 5 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 6 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, 7 that the Department of Education is requested to convene a 8 9 working group to create a model statewide school policy on 10 student suicide prevention, intervention, and postvention in 11 grades K-12 by September 1, 2021; and 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the policy is requested to be 13 14 developed in consultation with school and community stakeholders, school-employed mental health professionals and 15 suicide prevention experts and, at a minimum, address the 16 17 following: 18 19 (1) Mental health and substance use; 20 (2) Childhood abuse, neglect, or trauma; 21 22 (3) Prolonged stress, such as bullying or harassment and 23 stressful life events, including rejection, breakups, 24 25 or loss; 26 (4) 27 Exposure to another person's suicide or sensationalized depictions of suicide; 28 29 30 (5) Previous suicide attempts or history of suicide within the family; 31 32 33 (6) How to use expertise of school employees who have been 34 trained in recognizing suicide risk and referral 35 procedures; 36 How school employees should respond to a crisis 37 (7) 38 situation where a student is in imminent danger to the 39 student's self;

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Policies and protocols for communication with parents, 1 (8) 2 including those that specify how to proceed if parental notification is not in the best interest of 3 the student; 4 5 (9) Counseling services available with the school for 6 students and their families related to suicide 7 8 prevention; and 9 10 (10)Development of a plan to assist survivors of attempted suicide and assist students and school employees; and 11 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the policy is requested to 13 address the needs of high-risk groups, including but not limited 14 to the following: 15 16 Youth with disabilities or with chronic health 17 (1)conditions, including mental health and substance use 18 conditions; 19 20 (2) Youth experiencing homelessness or in out-of-home 21 22 settings, such as foster care; and 23 Lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, 24 (3) queer/questioning, intersex, asexual, and pansexual 25 (LGBTQ+) youth; and 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is 28 requested to post this model policy by January 1, 2022, on the 29 Department's website, along with relevant resources and 30 information to support schools in developing and implementing 31 the policy; and 32 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested 34 to review the impact of the suicide prevention policy every 35 fifth year and, if necessary, update the policy; and 36

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the Board of
Education, Superintendent of Education, and Executive Director
of the State Public Charter School Commission.

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
