SENATE RESOLUTION

RECOGNIZING OCTOBER 4 THROUGH OCTOBER 8, 2021, AS DIGITAL INCLUSION WEEK IN THE STATE OF HAWAII.

WHEREAS, broadband services are essential infrastructure 1 2 for the twenty-first century and play an important role in 3 providing access to knowledge and opportunities from around the world; and 4 5 6 WHEREAS, digital equity ensures all individuals and communities have the information technology capacity needed for 7 full participation in our society, democracy, and economy and is 8 9 necessary for civic and cultural participation, lifelong learning, and access to essential services, such as 10 telemedicine, distance learning, and the workplace; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic 14 has heightened the demand for reliable, affordable internet connectivity as work, education, as access to essential services 15 16 have shifted toward being provided online; and 17 WHEREAS, broadband access protects public health during the 18 COVID-19 pandemic, while addressing socioeconomic disparities 19 20 for the most vulnerable Hawaii residents who live in underrepresented communities; and 21 22 WHEREAS, many rural, agricultural, and lower-income 23 24 communities throughout the State lack access to reliable and 25 affordable broadband due to the lack of infrastructure; discrimination in investment in delivering technology and 26 technology-related services to specific areas or populations; or 27 28 barriers derived from socioeconomic status, education, literacy, language, or disabilities; and 29 30 31 WHEREAS, the State is committed to promoting digital inclusion to ensure that all individuals and communities, 32 including the most disadvantaged, have access to and the use of 33 34 information and communication technologies, including

35 affordable, robust broadband internet service; internet-enabled 36 devices that meet the needs of the user; access to digital

literacy training; quality technical support; and applications 1 2 and online content designed to enable and encourage self-3 sufficiency, participation, and collaboration; and 4 5 WHEREAS, in his State of the State address on January 25, 6 2021, Governor David Ige called for the State to expand its investments in digital technology of Hawaii 2.0, thereby 7 8 dedicating the State to being a leader in broadband access; and 9 10 WHEREAS, Digital Inclusion Week 2021 is put on by the National Digital Inclusion Alliance, who represents affiliated 11 organizations working toward digital equity by crafting, 12 13 identifying, and disseminating financial and operational resources for digital inclusion programs to raise awareness of 14 solutions addressing home internet access, personal devices, and 15 16 local technology training and support programs; now, therefore, 17 18 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 19 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, that October 4 through October 8, 2021, is recognized as Digital 20 21 Inclusion Week in the State to raise awareness of digital equity 22 and promote digital inclusion; and 23 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 25 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor and Director of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism. 26 27 28 OFFERED BY: funite Minlub 29
