SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THAT THE CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU PROTECT PEDESTRIANS ON SIDEWALKS BY CREATING SEPARATE FACILITIES FOR ELECTRIC SCOOTERS, ELECTRIC BICYCLES, AND ELECTRIC TRIKES.

WHEREAS, electric scooters, electric bicycles, and three-1 wheeled electric trikes have become widely available for 2 personal transportation, are very popular with commercial tour 3 operators, and are often ridden on Oahu's sidewalks where they 4 mix with pedestrians and motorists; and 5 6 7 WHEREAS, while electric scooters, electric bicycles, and electric trikes are convenient, affordable, and more 8 environmentally-friendly than automobiles, they are a safety 9 hazard when ridden on sidewalks; and 10 11 WHEREAS, electric scooters, electric bicycles, and electric 12 trikes can weigh more than forty pounds and can be modified to 13 allow the devices to reach speeds of eighteen miles per hour, 14 which is nearly six times faster than the average walking speed 15 of a person; and 16 17 18 WHEREAS, electric scooters, electric bicycles, and electric trikes can seriously injure or kill pedestrians in a collision 19 and operators of these devices are at risk from motorists who do 20 not expect a small, quiet, and fast-moving motorized device to 21 appear in pedestrian rights-of-way; and 22 23 WHEREAS, the Legislature passed Act 180, Session Laws of 24 25 Hawaii 2003 (Act 180), which defines an "electric personal assistive mobility device" as a self-balancing, two-wheeled, 26 non-tandem-wheeled device, designed to transport only one 27 28 person, using an electric propulsion system that limits the 29 maximum speed of the device to twelve and one-half miles per hour or less; and 30 31



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WHEREAS, Act 180 states that unless otherwise prohibited or 1 2 regulated by a county ordinance, electric personal assistive mobility devices may be operated on sidewalks at a speed no 3 greater than eight miles per hour and on bicycle paths in the 4 5 State; and 6 WHEREAS, in the absence of county regulations, many 7 8 electric scooters and electric bicycles are allowed on sidewalks and bike paths as electric personal assistive mobility devices 9 and, although three-wheeled electric trikes do not necessarily 10 fall within this definition, they are frequently used by 11 individuals and tour operators on pedestrian paths; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, within the past several years, pedestrians and motorists have expressed safety concerns to policymakers about 15 the increasing number of individuals and tour operators riding 16 electric scooters, electric bicycles, and electric trikes on 17 sidewalks; and 18 19 20 WHEREAS, policymakers must balance the advantages of useful, emerging mobility device technology with public safety, 21 particularly in crowded transportation environments such as 22 23 Oahu's business districts and urban core; now, therefore, 24 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 25 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, 26 27 that the City and County of Honolulu, Honolulu Police Department, Honolulu Department of Transportation Services, and 28 29 Department of Transportation are requested to work with the Honolulu City Council to protect pedestrians on the sidewalks by 30 providing separate protected facilities for the operation of 31 32 electric scooters, electric bicycles, and electric trikes; and 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Honolulu Department of 34 Transportation Services is requested to submit a report of its 35 findings and recommendations, including any proposed 36 legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior 37 38 to the convening of the Regular Session of 2022; and 39 40 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Transportation, 41 42 Mayor of the City and County of Honolulu, Chairperson of the
