## SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO INCLUDE THE TEACHING OF FINANCIAL LITERACY IN THE EXISTING PERSONAL TRANSITION PLAN COURSE REQUIREMENT FOR EACH STUDENT.

1 WHEREAS, financial education is a lifelong learning process 2 that empowers individuals to plan for their futures; and 3 WHEREAS, in the past, the educational system has assumed 4 that students will learn important financial skills from their 5 families; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, not all students are being taught the financial skills they will need to be successful later in life; and 9 10 11 WHEREAS, the lack of financial literacy in students poses a 12 significant barrier for individuals seeking to achieve financial prosperity and stability; and 13 14 15 WHEREAS, personal financial education is essential to ensure that our youth are prepared to manage money, credit, and 16 17 debt and to become responsible workers, heads of households, investors, entrepreneurs, business leaders, and citizens; and 18 19 20 WHEREAS, it is of the utmost importance to educate Hawaii's youth in economic and financial matters to prepare them for 21 financial independence through the development of fiscal 22 23 responsibility and financial management skills; and 24 25 WHEREAS, although the Department of Education offers a 26 financial literacy elective course, it is not required; and 27 WHEREAS, some amount of basic skills and knowledge of 28 financial literacy should be required for all students; now, 29 therefore. 30 31 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 32 33 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021,



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that the Department of Education is urged to include the 1 teaching of financial literacy in the existing personal 2 transition plan course requirement for each student; and 3 4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is 5 urged to ensure consistency in the financial literacy course; 6 7 and 8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is 9 urged to submit a report of its findings and recommendations, 10 including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later 11 than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session 12 of 2022; and 13 14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 15 Resolution be transmitted to the Superintendent of Education and 16 Chairperson of the Board of Education. 17

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
