## SENATE RESOLUTION

ENCOURAGING THE CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU TO PLAN FOR THE NECESSARY IMPROVEMENTS TO, AND REVITALIZATION OF, HANS L'ORANGE PARK.

WHEREAS, over time, Waipahu has evolved as a result of the 1 area's economic mainstay, the Oahu Sugar Company; and 2 3 WHEREAS, the Oahu Sugar Company was established in 1897 and 4 was a major contributor to Waipahu's growth and prosperity; and 5 6 WHEREAS, Waipahu is a classic example of a diverse sugar 7 plantation town; and 8 9 WHEREAS, as a primary source of employment, the plantation 10 attracted a mix of immigrant workers who formed a community of 11 various cultures, traditions, and lifestyles; and 12 13 WHEREAS, Hans L'Orange was an Oahu Sugar Company manager 14 who, in 1924, persuaded his superiors to authorize the use of 15 several acres of low-yielding sugar cane land upon which to 16 17 build a recreation area for workers; and 18 WHEREAS, L'Orange believed that wholesome recreational and 19 social activities were the keys to happiness and health for the 20 plantation workers; and 21 22 WHEREAS, in 1972, this recreation area was renamed Hans 23 24 L'Orange Park; and 25 WHEREAS, as part of the Waipahu 2000 Plan, a "passive park" 26 area that would retain most of the mature trees was incorporated 27 into Hans L'Orange Park allowing for the expansion of the 28 baseball field at the Hans L'Orange Park for professional-level 29 use; and 30

WHEREAS, consequently, Hans L'Orange Park has hosted home 1 games for the Waipahu High School Marauders and Hawaii Pacific 2 University Sharks baseball teams; and 3 4 WHEREAS, in the mid-1990's to early 2000's, the Hans 5 L'Orange Park was the ballpark of choice for the Hawaii Winter 6 Baseball Leagues and other local and regional baseball teams and 7 8 leagues; and 9 10 WHEREAS, Hans L'Orange Park includes a commemorative monument saluting nineteen Waipahu sports legends, including 11 Hans L'Orange; brothers Fred, Johnny, Eddie and Chester Yasui; 12 Andy Ganigan; Al Silva; Henry "Prince" Oana; Kenneth Kimura; 13 Richard Oamilda; Chrispin Mancao; Katsuji Kojima; Brown Watabu; 14 Walter Gouveia, Sr.; Masa Yonamine; James Moniz; Takemi Arakawa; 15 Dr. Richard Noda; and Mac Flores; and 16 17 WHEREAS, Hans L'Orange Park has not been immune to the 18 19 ravages of time and neglect; and 20 WHEREAS, Hans L'Orange Park and its surrounding facilities, 21 including the bathroom facilities, play areas, parking 22 facilities, and baseball field, have deteriorated, resulting in 23 limited use and unsafe conditions; and 24 25 WHEREAS, the homeless population has encroached on the park 26 grounds, thus creating an unsafe and unsanitary situation; and 27 28 WHEREAS, Hans L'Orange Park is one of several district 29 30 parks serving Waipahu; and 31 WHEREAS, due to Hans L'Orange Park's celebrated historical 32 33 past and the park's location in the Waipahu Heritage District, it is imperative that Hans L'Orange Park be repaired and 34 restored so that the park may once again be a safe place for 35 recreation and social gathering for the Waipahu community and 36 37 visitors; and 38 WHEREAS, Hans L'Orange Park is approaching its one 39 hundred-year anniversary; and 40 41

WHEREAS, the repair, restoration, and revitalization of 1 2 Hans L'Orange Park, including the "passive park" green space, bathroom facilities, play areas, parking facilities, baseball 3 field, and other ancillary facilities, will enable the City and 4 County of Honolulu and the Waipahu community to promote a sense 5 of place and showcase community spirit based on the area's rich 6 and colorful plantation heritage; now, therefore, 7 8 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first 9 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, 10 that the City and County of Honolulu is encouraged to plan for 11 the necessary improvements to, and revitalization of, Hans 12 L'Orange Park, including the design of the revitalized park and 13 the repairs necessary to restore park facilities; and 14 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that City and County of Honolulu 16 officials are encouraged to seek input from Waipahu residents 17 and relevant community organizations and businesses to determine 18 the appropriate improvements to be made to Hans L'Orange Park; 19 and 20 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 22 Resolution be transmitted to the Mayor of the City and County of 23 Honolulu, Chair of the Honolulu City Council, Director of Parks 24 and Recreation of the City and County of Honolulu, Director of 25 Design and Construction for the City and County of Honolulu, and 26 27 Director of Facility Maintenance of the City and County of 28 Honolulu. 29 30 31 OFFERED BY: Carence & Sishiham
