## SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY TO INCREASE ITS INVESTMENT IN COMPREHENSIVE OFFENDER REENTRY TRAINING PROGRAMS FOR INDIVIDUALS EXITING CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES.

1 WHEREAS, individuals with histories of arrests and criminal convictions are routinely blocked from employment, housing, and 2 educational opportunities due to state and local restrictions, 3 4 as well as social stigma; and 5 WHEREAS, according to the U.S. Department of Justice Bureau 6 7 of Justice Statistics, ninety-five percent of people incarcerated in state prisons will eventually be released back 8 into the community; and 9 10 WHEREAS, reentry programs focused on helping persons 11 12 exiting jails and prisons obtain post-secondary education, housing, employment, and treatment foster a smoother and more 13 successful transition from incarceration back into their 14 15 communities, resulting in reduced recidivism and improved public safety; and 16 17 18 WHEREAS, the coronavirus 2019 pandemic and the continuing economic fallout have exacerbated existing barriers to 19 20 successful prisoner reintegration due, in part, to high unemployment and increased demand for housing assistance; and 21 22 23 WHEREAS, the Department of Public Safety is statutorily required to provide comprehensive and effective reentry planning 24 for adults exiting correctional facilities; and 25 26 WHEREAS, not having civil identification documents makes it 27 nearly impossible to obtain housing and legal employment, both 28 of which are foundational pieces to successful reentry into 29 communities; and 30 31 WHEREAS, despite the Department of Public Safety's 32 statutory mandate to provide civil identification documents to 33 persons exiting correctional facilities, pursuant to section 34



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353H-32, Hawaii Revised Statutes, roughly half are exiting jails 1 and prisons without such documentation; and 2 3 WHEREAS, persons exiting correctional facilities without 4 5 proper identification will have fewer legal means to support themselves and will require additional state support and 6 resources; now, therefore, 7 8 9 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, 10 that the Department of Public Safety is urged to increase 11 12 investment in comprehensive offender reentry programs for individuals exiting correctional facilities; and 13 14 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Public Safety is encouraged to, at the very least, maintain its existing 16 reentry services and its funding for those contracts during the 17 current economic crisis; and 18 19 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Public Safety is encouraged to identify meaningful opportunities to divest 21 22 from its retributive approach to corrections and to reinvest in reentry support programs; and 23 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Public Safety 25 26 is urged to actively seek information regarding existing barriers to successful offender reentry and is encouraged to 27 work with community stakeholders to develop, support, and 28 implement policy changes that dismantle these barriers; and 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Public Safety 31 is requested to fully comply with its statutory obligation to 32 provide exiting offenders with civil identification documents, 33 34 and to expeditiously identify and correct issues that result in noncompliance; and 35 36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this 37 Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Public Safety. 38 39 40 41 OFFERED BY: Claume K chickiher
