SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE HAWAII EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY TO CONVENE A TASK FORCE TO STUDY AND IDENTIFY APPROPRIATE STOCKPILE STORAGE FACILITY OPTIONS TO STORE AND DISTRIBUTE EMERGENCY SUPPLIES IN THE STATE OF HAWAII.

WHEREAS, the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic 1 2 has ravaged the State's available inventories of personal protection equipment and other medical products and supplies; 3 4 and 5 WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic has identified a critical 6 7 gap in the State's ability to mitigate impacts on its vulnerable 8 supply chain; and 9 10 WHEREAS, there is a pressing need for the State to accumulate reserves of critical supplies to provide to the 11 counties and communities during an emergency and within a 12 13 reasonable time of the State's decision to deploy the stockpiled reserves; and 14 15 WHEREAS, an appropriate stockpile storage facility is 16 necessary to prepare for future natural disasters and pandemics 17 to supplement and resupply state and local inventories of 18 19 essential supplies during emergencies that may be severe enough 20 to exhaust local supplies; and 21 22 WHEREAS, a single stockpile storage facility in a central location may be inefficient due to limited air and sea delivery 23 24 assets during a natural disaster or pandemic causing delays which may hinder the distribution of emergency supplies to all 25 four counties in Hawaii; and 26 27 28 WHEREAS, the creation of a task force to identify appropriate stockpile storage facility options would present 29 possible solutions as to whether it is more appropriate to have 30 a single storage facility on the island of Oahu or whether it 31 32 may be more prudent to utilize multiple storage facilities 33 spread throughout the four counties in the State to effectively and efficiently distribute emergency supplies; now, therefore, 34

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(9) 1 Two representatives from the County of Kauai, 2 appointed by the Mayor of Kauai County; and 3 4 (10) Two representatives from the County of Maui, appointed 5 by the Mayor of Maui County; and 6 7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all members of the task force be appointed no later than thirty days after the last day of the 8 9 Regular Session of 2021, and that the task force convene its initial meeting on or before July 1, 2021; and 10 11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to 12 submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including 13 any proposed legislation, to the Legislature not later than 14 15 January 31, 2022; and 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force include in its 17 report appropriate locations for the construction of a state 18 stockpile storage facility or facilities in which to stockpile 19 emergency supplies necessary for responding to natural disasters 20 and pandemics and the location or locations identified shall be: 21 22 23 (1) On state land; 24 (2) Reasonably secured or easily capable of being 25 26 reasonably secured; 27 28 (3) Outside of the inundation zone; 29 30 (4) Within a one-mile radius of an airfield; and 31 32 (5) Near state, county, and federal first responder agencies; and 33 34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force shall dissolve 35 on July 1, 2022; and 36 37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 38 Resolution be transmitted to the Director of the Hawaii 39 Emergency Management Agency, Executive Director of Hawaii 40 Technology Development Corporation, Mayor of Hawaii County, 41
