## SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING PUBLIC UTILITIES TO PROVIDE FIFTY PERCENT RATE DISCOUNTS TO RETIRED SENIOR CITIZENS.

WHEREAS, many retired senior citizens aged sixty years and 1 2 older live on fixed incomes and tight budgets that require them 3 to limit or curtail the purchase of discretionary goods or services; and 4 5 WHEREAS, expenses that cannot be easily limited or-6 7 curtailed are those offered by public utilities that provide electricity, water, gas, telephone, telecommunications, and 8 9 taxicab services; and 10 WHEREAS, the gap between the costs of these services and 11 the fixed incomes of retired senior citizens will tend to widen 12 over time, making it increasingly difficult for a retired senior 13 citizen to budget accordingly; and 14 15 16 WHEREAS, proactive measures must be taken so that retired senior citizens can maintain a reasonable quality of life and 17 18 afford increasing public utility costs; now, therefore, 19 20 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, 21 that any public utility having a certificate of public 22 convenience and necessity issued by the Public Utilities 23 Commission is requested to provide a fifty percent rate discount 24 to any retired senior citizen residing in the State; and 25 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Public Utilities Commission is requested to survey actions that have been taken by public 28 utilities or determine what legislation that needs to be 29 30 enacted, if any, to provide a fifty percent rate discounts to 31 retired senior citizens; and 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Public Utilities Commission 33 is requested to submit a report of its findings and 34 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the 35



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Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 1 the Regular Session of 2022; and 2

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 4 5 Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Commerce and Consumer Affairs and Chairperson of the Public Utilities 6 7 Commission, who in turn is requested to distribute copies of the Concurrent Resolution to all public utilities that currently 8 9 hold a certificate of public convenience and necessity issued by 10 the Commission.
