SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE GOVERNOR, DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, AND POLICE DEPARTMENT OF EACH COUNTY, TO DEVELOP AN EXPANDED STATEWIDE PUBLIC AWARENESS CAMPAIGN TO EDUCATE THE PUBLIC ABOUT THE STATE'S "MOVE OVER LAW".

WHEREAS, according to the United States Department of 1 Transportation, more than one hundred fifty law enforcement 2 officers were struck and killed by vehicles between 1997 and 3 4 2019; and 5 WHEREAS, in 2012, in response to two separate vehicle-6 7 related officer deaths, Hawaii enacted a "move over law", which was codified in section 291C-27, Hawaii Revised Statutes; and 8 9 WHEREAS, section 291C-27, Hawaii Revised Statutes, requires 10 that drivers, upon approaching an emergency vehicle that is 11 stopped for an emergency, slow down to a reasonable speed and, 12 13 if necessary, make a lane change into the adjacent lane; and 14 15 WHEREAS, on May 14, 2019, the Hawaii Department of Transportation posted a short public service announcement on its 16 YouTube channel to raise public awareness of the State's "move 17 over law"; and 18 19 20 WHEREAS, the recent death of a tow truck driver who was struck and killed by a vehicle while responding to an emergency 21 on the H-2 freeway demonstrates that noncompliance with the 22 State's "move over law" remains an issue; and 23 24 WHEREAS, a more effective public awareness campaign will 25 help to increase compliance with the State's "move over law"; 26 now, therefore, 27 28 29 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, 30 31 that the Governor, Department of Transportation, and Department of Health, in conjunction with the respective police departments 32
