Your Committee on Judiciary & Hawaiian Affairs, to which was referred S.B. No. 1050, S.D. 1, entitled:

"A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD CHECKS,"

begs leave to report as follows:

The purpose of this measure is to add the Department of the Attorney General to the list of agencies that are authorized to conduct criminal history record checks on current or prospective employees or employees or agents of contractors who have access to federal tax information.

Your Committee received testimony in support of this measure from the Department of the Attorney General, Department of Taxation, Department of Human Resources Development, and one individual.

Your Committee finds that the Internal Revenue Service requires that background checks be performed on all current and prospective employees and contractors who receive access to federal tax information. These background checks must be comprehensive and include a state and Federal Bureau of Investigation fingerprint-based background check. Your Committee further finds that the Department of the Attorney General requires
