Your Committee on Judiciary & Hawaiian Affairs, to which was referred S.B. No. 764, S.D. 1, H.D. 1, entitled:

"A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO HUMAN TRAFFICKING,"

begs leave to report as follows:

The purpose of this measure is to add a permanent commercial driver's license disqualification for a holder of a commercial driver's license or commercial learner's permit who is convicted of a felony involving a severe form of trafficking in persons while operating a commercial motor vehicle for which a commercial driver's license or permit is required.

Your Committee received testimony in support of this measure from the Department of Transportation, Hawaii Transportation Association, and four individuals.

Your Committee finds that on July 23, 2019, the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration of the United States Department of Transportation issued a final rule that provides that drivers who are convicted of a felony involving a severe form of trafficking in persons while operating a commercial motor vehicle for which a commercial driver's license or commercial learner's permit is required, are permanently banned from holding the license or permit without the possibility of reinstatement. Your Committee

further finds that the final rule requires states to achieve substantial compliance with the federal Act within three years of the final rule's effective date of September 23, 2019. This measure will bring the State into compliance with the federal rule.

As affirmed by the record of votes of the members of your Committee on Judiciary & Hawaiian Affairs that is attached to this report, your Committee is in accord with the intent and purpose of S.B. No. 764, S.D. 1, H.D. 1, and recommends that it pass Third Reading.
