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<u>HB 760</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE STATE FOUNDATION ON CULTURE AND THE ARTS. Allows the works of art special fund to be used for performing arts, under certain conditions. Includes posting of a recording of performing art as a form of public display. Defines performing arts. <u>HB 777</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO WORKS OF ART SPECIAL FUND. Deletes as a source of funds for the works of art special fund appropriations for capital renovations.	CAI, FIN
<u>HB 1083</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE LAW OF THE SPLINTERED PADDLE. Prohibits a county from enacting any ordinance that prohibits a person from lying by the roadside in safety in accordance with the law of the splintered paddle.	CAI, JHA
<u>HB 242</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., DAY. Changes the name of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Day to Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr./How Would They Feel Day.	CAI, JHA
<u>HB 1193</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR THE STATE. Appropriates funds for capital improvement projects relating to the state archives and Iolani Palace.	CAI, FIN
<u>HB 627</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO SPECIAL LICENSE PLATES. Authorizes the issuance of special number electric vehicle license plates to commemorate the Polynesian Voyaging Society.	CAI, FIN

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least **24 hours** prior to the hearing. Testimony received after this time will be stamped late and left to the discretion of the chair to consider. While every effort will be made to incorporate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed, may not be processed.

Testimony submitted will be placed on the legislative website. This public posting of testimony on the website should be considered when including personal information in your testimony.

The chair may institute a per-testifier time limit.

Committees meeting in the morning must adjourn prior to the day's Floor Session. Therefore, due to time constraints, not all testifiers may be provided an opportunity to offer verbal comments. However, remote testifiers' written submissions will be considered by the committee.

Please refrain from profanity or uncivil behavior. Violations may result in ejection from the hearing without the ability to rejoin.

The House will not be responsible for bad connections on the testifier's end.

The cable TV broadcast and/or live stream of this meeting will include closed captioning.
