Establishes a pilot program to generate revenue through the lease of public library lands to meet the mission of the public libraries. Establishes the library facilities fund. Requires the state librarian and board of education to report to the legislature.	EDU, WAM
<a href="#">SB 144</a> <a href="#">Status &amp; Testimony</a>	RELATING TO A SCHOOL SUPPLY SUBSIDY PILOT PROGRAM. Establishes and make an appropriation for a one-year school supply subsidy pilot program at Na'alehu elementary school.	EDU, WAM
<a href="#">SB 220</a> <a href="#">Status &amp; Testimony</a>	RELATING TO SERVICE-LEARNING. Requires the Department of Education to implement a service-learning curriculum to develop student character, values, self-esteem, civic responsibility, and knowledge of local community issues and concerns though community service volunteer work. <a href="#">SB 242</a> <a href="#">Status &amp; Testimony</a>	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Requires public and charter schools to offer education in computer science. Requires annual reports.	EDU, WAM
<a href="#">SB 463</a> <a href="#">Status &amp; Testimony</a>	RELATING TO GARDENS. Authorizes the Department of Education to develop programs to encourage the development of gardens on school property. Authorizes the Hawaii Community Development Authority to develop programs that provide incentives to establish gardens in housing projects, communities, and schools.	EDU, WAM
