Dear Friends and Neighbors:

I hope this finds you and your families well.

At the Capitol, we completed the legislative session on May 3, 2012. This year, in addition to the budget conference committee, I served on 56 conference committees, both for bills I had introduced and for bills relating to my position as Vice Chair of the Committee on Water, Land, and Ocean Resources. During conference the House and Senate put in long hours coming to agreement on a number of important bills which we then voted on in the days before adjourning on May 3rd.

Some of the bills upon which I focused for West Oahu include: (1) Special Purpose Revenue Bond for Saint Francis Hospital, with the hope of getting a new hospital opened at the former HMC West site, (2) a study to extend the zipper lane to Kapolei, (3) incentives for a film studio to be built at UHWO, (4) amendments to the ignition interlock law allowing repeat offenders into the program, (5) \$400,000 in funding for the Malama Learning Center, and (6) funding for additional ambulances for the leeward side.

THE 2013 BUDGET

The 2013 budget was finalized on Saturday, April 28th at 3:00 a.m. Subsequently, forty-seven bills were held until the budget closed, and were approved in conference committee on May 1st, and May 3rd the final day of session. This session was challenging but rewarding. As always, it has been a great honor to once again serve as your Representative for our district.

One of our biggest challenges this year was the State Budget. Fortunately, the budget is in a far better position this year than it has been in the past and I believe that we have made real progress towards long-term financial stability for our state. Reaching this point required very long hours and very tough compromises on the part of lawmakers, particularly in regards to Capitol Improvement Projects (CIPs).

Transit Alert: H-1 Lights Coming Back On


