Dear Friends,

I want to take this opportunity to thank you for allowing me to serve as your Representative for the 49th District encompassing the mauka side of Kaneohe, as well as Maunawili and Olomana. I also want to give you a summary of this year's legislative session, highlighting some of the bills I either sponsored or supported that may be of interest to you.

This session I was again part of leadership as Majority Whip and as such, I supported the goals of the House Majority aimed at crafting a fiscally sound budget while addressing the state priorities such as homelessness, affordable housing, prison overcrowding, alternative energy, diversified agriculture, and air-conditioning for our public schools. In addition, we succeeded in licensing medical marijuana dispensaries and prepaying \$81 million in health care benefits for future state retirees.

As Chair of the Committee on Veterans and Military and International Affairs and Culture and the Arts, I supported legislation that benefits our military and their dependents. In the cultural arena, I'm happy to report that the UH theater and dance programs will receive funds to continue producing its award-winning programs in Asian theatre.


In regards to community-related issues, I continue to work on resolving long-standing problems of illegal parking, trespassing and vandalism affecting several of our popular hiking trails. Discussions continue with HRT., landowners of Royal Hawaiian Golf Course, the city Department of Permitting and Planning and the Department of Land and Natural Resources (DLNR) to find an appropriate parking site for Maunawili Falls Trail. Currently, DLNR is requesting the release of \$200,000 for the proposed parking lot. I have also contacted the city Department of Construction and Design to clarify ownership of Luana Hills Road, which leads to the golf course and where hikers often park.

Featured in this newsletter are highlights of the 2016 Legislative Session, including CIP appropriations for our district.

Out of the over 1,000 bills introduced a few hundred were passed by the Legislature this legislative session. Of those bills passed by the Legislature, following are just a few which I felt are of importance to our community.

Education

SB3126 SD2 HD2 CD1 - Relating to Public

Education: Appropriates \$100 million for air conditioning, heat abatement, and related energy efficiency measures at public schools.

SB2833 SD2 HD2 CD1 - Relating to The Low-income Housing Tax Credit:

Increases funding for affordable rental housing development by making the State Low-income Housing Tax Credit more valuable. Reduces State Tax Credit period from ten to five years.



Transportation

SB2618 SD1 HD2 CD1 – Relating to **Transportation:**

Requires the Department of Transportation to conduct a feasibility study of establishing an interisland and intra-island ferry system.

HB2049 HD2 SD2 CD1 - Relating to **Transportation:**

Establishes the roads commission to make recommendations on the ownership of private roads. Adds roads, alleys, streets, ways, lanes, bikeways, and bridges to the list of public highways or public trails that can be dedicated or condemned. Appropriate funds for the repair and maintenance of specific roads.



Energy

SB2652 SD2 HD2 CD1 – Relating to Taxation:

Establishes a 5-year renewable fuels production tax credit applicable to taxable years beginning after 12/31/2016. Repeals the ethanol facility tax credit.

Military and Veteran Affairs

HB1807 HD2 SD1 CD1 – Relating to Military Service:

Authorizes reserve and national guard members to receive paid military leave while on inactive-duty training.

HB2489 SD1 CD1 - Relating to the **Department of Defense:**

Appropriates funds for the establishment of a veterans' services counselor IV position within the Office of Veterans' Services to assist all veterans, with a primary focus on female veterans and \$200,000 for the Vietnam veterans' fiftieth anniversary commemoration.

HCR129 - Designating June 27, 2016, as "Post-Traumatic Stress

SB3084 SD1 HD2 CD1 -

Relating to Cesspools: Amends the cesspool upgrade, conversion, or connection income tax credit by making it available for cesspools within a tax map key area in which more than one residence is connected to a large-capacity cesspool.



Consumer Protection

HB1578 HD2 SD1 CD1 – Relating to Theft: Establishes the offense of theft of urn as a class C felony. Requires scrap dealers to follow the same requirements regarding a

written statement for the purchase of an urn as they do for the purchase of copper or a beer keg.
