"KEEP HAWAII'S HEROES" CAMPAIGN

The "Keep Hawaii's Heroes" campaign is gathering support to try to avoid a massive cut in the workforce at Schofield Barracks and Fort Shafter. As part of its 2020 force structure realignment, the Army is considering eliminating 19,800 soldiers and civilians from both bases (Schofield Barracks - 16,606 and Fort Shafter - 3,786).

In addition to the workers, Hawaii would lose more than 30,000 family members. The total is about 5% of Honolulu's total population - severely impacting the communities of Wahiawa, Mililani, Haleiwa and Waialua.

If those losses were to happen, an Army study says Hawaii's economy would lose more than \$1.35 BILLION, as well as a loss of \$9.2 MILLION in sales tax receipts.

The goal of the campaign is to gather more than 40,000 signatures by Jan. 20, 2015 and to have as many supporters possible at the Army's listening sessions in Hawaii scheduled for January 27, 2015 at Hale Koa Hotel.

Hawaii's soldiers are always there to help in time of need. It's now our turn to return the favor.

NHCSL will award scholarships to a total of eleven (11) Hispanic public high school students that reside in the district of a Hispanic State Legislator.

Isis Usborne, a valedictorian from the MHS Class of 2014, was one of just eleven students from across the U.S. selected to receive this college scholarship award from the National Hispanic Caucus of State Legislatures (NHCSL).

Each student will receive a one-time \$3,000.00 grant to use toward their higher education and will be recognized in their community for their excellent academic achievements.

It is important to encourage our students to excel in their academics and recognize them when they succeed.
