Second Anniversary of the Hawai'i Clean Energy Initiative

On October 20th 2008, our state signed an historic agreement with the Hawaiian Electric Companies to press forward with the goals of the Hawai'i Clean Energy Initiative to meet 70% of our energy needs through energy efficiency and renewable energy by 2030. This happens to be the first state-utility agreement of its kind in the nation. As we hit the two year anniversary, it's important to reflect on the progress we're making. At the same time, it's critical that we continue to move forward as quickly as possible, since we happen to be the most oil dependent state in the country, where: oil supplies 90% of our energy needs and costs us \$4-\$6 billion each year.

Our district here in West Oahu is proof that we are making progress. For example, on October 27th, I spoke at the Ground Breaking for the Kalaeloa Solar One project in Kalaeloa. This will be a 5 megawatt (MW) Concentrating Solar Power project. There are also plans to put in an additional 20-30 MW of solar farms in Kalaeloa over the next few years. Additionally, at the northern edge of my district in Kunia and Mililani will be a 20 MW solar farm headed up by Castle & Cooke. Not to mention that many families in our neighborhoods are getting solar water heaters and photovoltaic panels put on their homes every week to save on their electricity costs and at the same time do good for our environment.

Ideas for Legislation Welcome

The start of the 2011 Legislative Session will begin January 19th. As we get closer to the date, I'll be working on legislation to introduce. One of the best sources for ideas to improve the laws in our state is YOU! So far, these are some of the ideas that constituents have suggested to me for possible legislation:

- Enhance penalties for "hit and run" drivers
- Create a state bank that would provide consistent capital lending regardless of the economic conditions
- Establish a "Couples on the Brink" program at UH to offer divorce reconciliation services to couples who are considering ending their marriages
- Place a moratorium on the construction of new landfills or expansion of any private landfills on the Leeward Coast as of August 1, 2011
- Establish a self-employment assistance program in Hawai'i to allow our state to tap into the benefits of the existing U.S. Department of Labor program

If you have any ideas that you think should be considered in the next go around here at the Legislature, please let know.

Kapolei Interchange Complex Update

Makakilo/Kapolei/Honokai Hale Neighborhood Board Chair, Maeda Timson, asked that I update the community on what's going on with the Kapolei Interchange Complex that is currently being constructed by our State Department of Transportation (DOT). We ran the following three questions by their Community Affairs Office and here are the responses we got back:

- How long will the sidewalk on Makakilo Drive be closed off while DOT is working on the H-1 West on-ramp?
 Tie-in of new westbound on-ramp will be completed in January 2011. Sidewalk will be reopened at that time as well. (However, on-ramp won't open until mid-2011 because of other related infrastructure work)
- Will cars coming down Makakilo Drive getting on the H-1 West on-ramp have to stop at a traffic signal or will they just continue unimpeded like the existing H-1 East onramp?

Vehicles coming down from Makakilo will not have to stop at a traffic signal to enter the H-1 Westbound Onramp.

When will Phase 1 open up for use by the public?
 Current project completion date is mid-2011.

Pointer Field Irrigation to be Fixed Soon

Back in August, I was contacted by a constituent who was very frustrated by the condition of Pointer Field in Kalaeloa. As you may know, many youth in West Oahu use the field for sporting activities. The problem is that the irrigation system was broken, which made the field too hard to



play on. I met the constituent out at the field to check it out myself. I then contacted City Parks Director, Lester Chang, to see if they could look into fixing the irrigation system. I was happy to have received a letter from Mr. Chang at the end of September stating that "on September 13th, 2010 a work order was submitted to have the irrigation system repaired. Also, timer was reset to increase the time of watering." This is great news! Mahalo to Lester and his team for a job well-done.

Drive Safe 4 Ewa-Kapolei/Live and Let Live 2010 Campaign

The Holiday Season is just around the corner and so is the Drive Safe 4 Ewa-Kapolei/Live and Let Live 2010 Campaign. The purpose of this campaign is to bring increasing awareness of the dangers of speeding, and drinking and driving on the Westside. 

Congratulations to Judge Faauuga To'oto'o


It was an honor attending the swearing-in ceremony for Circuit Court Judge Faauuga To'oto'o at the State Supreme Court on October 7th. Judge To'oto'o has been a district court judge since 1994. He was raised in American Samoa and happens to be the first Circuit Court judge of Samoan ancestry in Hawai'i history. Congratulations to Judge To'oto'o for achieving this well-deserved position. Here are the comments I made on the floor of the Senate when we voted to unanimously confirm his nomination as a Circuit Court judge on August 6th.

"Madame President, I rise in support of the motion to consent to the confirmation of Faauuga To'oto'o as Circuit Court Judge of the First Circuit. First, I'd like to say, my decision is not based on Judge To'oto'o's ethnicity, I've known Mr. To'oto'o for many years and agree with the overwhelming majority of the testifiers who spoke about how qualified he is to be a Circuit Court Judge.

Their photovoltaic system consists of 56



SunPower 315 watt photovoltaic modules and 3 SunPower 6000 watt inverters, which will allow them to produce a lot of energy from our plentiful Leeward sunshine.
