

## Rail Project Update




- On June 27, 2013, the U.S. House and U.S. Senate appropriation committees agreed to give Honolulu's rail project its full \$250 million funding share for 2014 – the single largest grant for any new startup project in the nation.
- The federal government is covering 30% of the cost of the project (\$1.15B).
- There's a federal court case being argued before the 9<sup>th</sup> Circuit Court which started on August 15<sup>th</sup>. The plaintiffs are seeking for the environmental impact statement for the project to be invalidated and construction to permanently be halted.
- On August 29th, the State Historic Preservation Division (SHPD) approved the archaeological reports for the rail project.
- If the City wins the case, the plan is to start construction by mid-September.
- East Kapolei to Aloha Stadium section to be completed by 2017.
- Aloha Stadium to Ala Moana section to be completed by 2019.

### PPSEAWA Dedicated Peace and Friendship Among Southeast Women



I donated a Hawai'i flag and prepared a certificate from the State Senate to congratulate the people of Fiji for hosting the 2013 Pan Pacific and Southeast Asia Women's Association(PPSEAWA) International Conference from August 24<sup>th</sup> to 30<sup>th</sup>. PPSEAWA is the only international women's organization devoted to peace and understanding in the Pacific and Southeast Asia. There are 23 chapters whose members are dedicated to identifying the needs and problems of today's women and children, protecting the status of women and children while promoting family and child welfare, furthering education, training and literacy programs for all ages, working to protect and improve the environment, as well as raising funds and providing support locally and region wide. PPSEAWA has a long history of organizing international conferences. Since the first international conference held during the summer of 1928 in Hawai'i, PPSEAWA conferences have provided opportunities for women to learn, discuss and act on global and regional issues. The 2013 International Conference will be held in Fiji where PPSEAWA members will be treated to the best of Fiji by President Neomai Katonivualiku and Ravesi Johnston, PPSEAWA International 1st Vice President and Conference Chairperson. ## H-1 PM Contraflow Lane and Kapolei Interchange, Phase II Update

The Senate Transportation and International Affairs Committee, which I serve on, got an update on upcoming H-1 and H-2 freeway projects on July 25<sup>th</sup>. The two projects in our district that were discussed were the H-1 PM Contraflow Lane and the Kapolei Interchange, Phase II. Construction on the H-1 PM Contraflow Lane began in June 2012 and is expected to be completed by August 2014. The project will cost a total of \$82 million with \$16.4 million coming from the state and the rest from our the federal government. The Kapolei Interchange, Phase II will include the construction of the Wakea Street overpass and the on- and off-ramps. Construction of this project will start in September 2014 and is expected to be completed by September 2017. The total price tag will be \$48 million with the federal government kicking in \$38.4 million of that amount.

### Traffic

I hope you're surviving the "Beat the School" jam. As you're most likely painfully aware, on August 26<sup>th</sup> about 52,000 college and private school students began their fall semester. Our state Department of Transportation (DOT) is making several efforts to lessen the impact of the flood of new traffic on our roads. DOT did postpone its construction related lane closures during the week of August 26<sup>th</sup> and has also created a new GoAkamai App to help provide traffic congestion information for iPhone, iPad, and Android mobile device users. The App is available on the Android and iPhone App stores. But please be sure you're not using the App while driving. 😊

### Development of Kapolei Fairgrounds

The Hawai'i Housing Finance & Development Corporation (HHFDC) announced on August 10<sup>th</sup> that they are seeking competitive bids from private developers to develop the 27-acre "Fairgrounds" parcel fronting Walmart in Kapolei. HHFDC is considering both leasing and selling the property. The parcel was originally planned for 4 projects – a commercial center, a church, a park-and-ride, and senior housing. However, the parcel was rezoned in 2001 to allow for both commercial and residential up to 60 ft. in height. HHFDC now says their objective is to have moderate priced housing and small-scale retail, including restaurants. HHFDC estimates selecting a preferred plan by April 2014. In 2007, the land was valued at \$34.3 million. Please stay tuned.
