

Ideas for Legislation

The 2016 Legislative Session will kick-off on January 20, 2016. Leading up to that date, I'll be working on bills to introduce with the goal of improving our quality of life. I'm also interested in getting ideas from you on things we can do at the Legislature to make positive changes. Please contact my office if you'd like to weigh in. It doesn't have to be a fully fleshed-out concept. All we need is a few bullet points to get the process going.

West O'ahu Education Town Hall Meeting

We're finalizing the details for the West O'ahu Education Town Hall Meeting, December 1st from 7pm to 9pm at the UH West O'ahu Multipurpose Room. The event is being sponsored by myself, Senator Espero, and Senator Nishihara and will focus on the Ewa, Kapolei, and Waipahu communities. The general theme of the Town Hall will be to inform the community about the situation with public K-12 school facilities, including electrical upgrades and AC, planned new schools, and curriculum.

We'll also have leaders from UH West O'ahu talk about the long range plans for the university, its innovative programs, and its role in serving the broader community. Governor Releases Funding for UH West O'ahu

I was very pleased to get word from Governor Ige on October 15th that he had released \$7 million in funding for the construction of a new Administration and Allied Health Facility at UH West O'ahu in Kapolei. The total cost for this project is \$36.7 million and the plan is to have it completed by 2018. This will make our great university even better!

Special Session for Judiciary Appointments

One of my duties as a State Senator is to collaborate with my colleagues on the confirmation of judges. The Senate will hold a Special Session on November 5th and 6th to consider the confirmation of three judicial appointments. The nominees are:

Sen. Gabbard toured the NOAA Daniel K Inouye Regional Center (IRC) on Ford Island, on Oct. 7. This world-class facility consolidates National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) programs and operations on Oahu into a single facility on federally-owned property at Ford Island where they manage programs on fisheries, ocean, coastal, climate, and atmospheric issues in the Pacific. These programs affect not just Hawai'i, but also the larger Pacific region. The NOAA IRC also provides educational tours for school children, helping them to better understand environmental stewardship, diverse marine ecosystems, weather, climate, geology, & culture. Honoring Don Harlor

I surprised Don Harlor with an Honorary Certificate from the State Legislature at the Ewa Beach Library on October 15th. In 2008, the Harlor ohana moved to Ewa Beach from Los Angeles. As you might remember, in 2011 O'ahu was hit by heavy rain and strong 55-mph winds which toppled power lines resulting in a lengthy power outage in Ewa Beach. A few months later, Japan experienced a

catastrophic earthquake and devastating tsunami, by which Hawai'i was threatened but miraculously spared. It was at that time, that Don Harlor helped to form the Ewa Emergency Preparedness Committee (Ewa EPC) and became its chair. Mr. Harlor led the Fwa



EPC in conducting a very successful inaugural "Get Ready Emergency Preparedness Fair" at Ewa Makai Middle School in 2011, followed by four more successful annual fairs. Thanks to Mr. Harlor's guidance, Ewa Beach has qualified as a NOAA-certified StormReady and TsunamiReady community. Mahalo to Don for his tireless hard work and dedication to making the Ewa community a safe place to live and raise families. We wish him luck as he steps down from the Ewa EPC in January. He has left a legacy that will be remembered and will inspire others for many years to come.

Honoring Ezra Mo'o

I had the opportunity to surprise Ezra Mo'o with an Honorary Certificate from the State Senate at the Makakilo Stake of the LDS Church on October 28th. Ezra was recognized as part of his Eagle Court of Honor Ceremony for achieving the rank of Eagle Scout. Ezra is the son of proud parents Tehina and Lori, and is a natural leader who is kind, giving, and respectful as well as being full of ambition--the good kind.

The scouting program has been an important part of Ezra's life since the age of 8 when he joined the Cub Scouts. Ezra has been an Assistant Patrol Leader, Patrol Leader, and Senior Patrol Leader. He is a recipient of the Arrow of Light Award, which is the highest award in Cub Scouting. For Ezra's Eagle Scout project, he coordinated all the work and equipment needed to paint multiplication charts on three flights of stairs at Maukalani Elementary.
