**C. Intent**

1. **Invest in the State's aging and obsolete IT infrastructure and move us into the 21<sup>st</sup> century.**

HB 200 HD1 SD1 CD1 appropriates over \$130 million for informational systems to streamline tax collections, maintain and share critical health information, as well provide for a secure communication network for the islands.

2. **Renovating and maintaining existing state-owned facilities to reduce general fund expenditures in the future.**

The CD proposes over \$200 million to fund renovations to the Department of Health's Waimano Ridge facility, HHSC's network of hospitals, and hundreds of other projects in the DOE, UH, DLNR, and DAGS.

3. **Designate appropriations for projects needed to address future capacity needs and economic growth.**

The Conference draft includes \$38.2 million to build an Advanced Technology and Science Center at Honolulu Community College and \$11.8 million for a dedicated facility for the Allied Health program at UH-West O`ahu. Additionally, renovations and expansion of the Foreign Trade Zone facility, as well as funding for Ewa Makai Middle School \$18 million, to complete the campus and reduce overcrowding in schools in the Ewa plain. The CD also includes \$30 million in funding for a new high school in Kihei, Maui.

4. **Transportation- Focus on repairing our Highways, expanding our harbors, and renovating the first thing most of our visitors see...our Airports.**

Approximately \$1.2 billion is appropriated for the Department of Transportation for projects such as \$70 million for the expansion of the Kona International Airport, \$140 million for Honolulu International Airport, as well as increased

capacity at our harbors (\$250 million), and dozens of road improvements and bridge repairs. These projects will continue the process of addressing the declining conditions of our roads and infrastructure.
