Aloha Friends and Neighbors,

We have continued to navigate our new normal after a challenging few weeks. We have seen the devastating impact the delta variant has had here in Hawai'i, and particularly on O'ahu, where case numbers have peaked and overwhelmed our hospitals. Healthcare workers have done everything possible to manage this crisis by setting up triage tents and flying in additional nurses to support their staff, but it will not be enough if we do not continue to do our part to mitigate the spread. Cases have thankfully declined in recent weeks, but covid fatalities have reached heartbreaking new highs in the last month, particularly within younger demographics.

Since restrictions were heightened last month, the additions of the new **Safe Access**Oahu and **SMART Health** programs were implemented to continue keeping our community safe. Thus far, they have seemed effective in dissuading gatherings and reducing the rate of covid infections which is critically important, especially as we enter flu season. I'd encourage you and your 'ohana to give yourselves additional immune support by getting your annual flu vaccine as well. The more safeguards you can give yourself and your loved ones at this time will prove to be extremely important in the months to come. I'm glad to see the expansion of DOH's **Operation Expanded Testing** program, which includes over 100 public schools registered for the weekly voluntary testing program that is administered on campus for DOE students, teachers and staff. The more accessible these services are for all members of our community, the safer and healthier we will be.

The good news is that while our infections rates have been decreasing, the state's vaccination rates have continued to increase throughout September as well. Be sure to log into your **Safe Travels** account and upload a photo of your vaccination card under the "SMART Health" section. Once your vaccination status has been verified, it will populate a QR code that can be scanned by local businesses requiring proof of vaccination upon entry, so you won't need to worry about carrying a hard copy of your card! I know these restrictions and policies have been taxing in the last year and a half, but we aren't out of the woods yet! As flu season begins we must continue to keep the health of our keiki and our community as our #1 priority.

HOW YOU CAN HELP PREVENT THE SPREAD OF COVID-19:

-Get vaccinated

-Stay home and take a COVID-19 test if you feel sick
-Keep exposed individuals home and isolated until receiving a negative COVID-19
-Report a positive test to your Primary Care Physician and employer

Remember: While fever, cough, difficulty breathing, or loss of taste or smell are usual signs of COVID-19, mild symptoms may include fatigue, muscle/body aches, headache, sore throat, congestion or runny nose.
