Aloha Friends and Neighbors,

I am thrilled to be writing to you all after the steady strides we have made in the past month. While the mandates we have faced here on O'ahu have been difficult, we are finally seeing the positive impacts they have had as our COVID case numbers continue to diminish as well as its devastating fatalities. What this has shown us is that our diligence is working. The Safe Access O'ahu and SMART Health programs were implemented to keep us safe, and their efficacies have been proven significant.

This month I met with my colleague Representative Ty Cullen and Assistant Superintendent Randall Tanaka of the DOE to discuss the timeline moving forward for Royal Kunia Elementary School. Representative Cullen and I were able to secure \$200,000 in plan and design monies to produce a proof of concept for the new school as we await the Phase 2 buildout of Royal Kunia. There are a number of factors that are not within the control of the State that play into the timeline for Royal Kunia Elementary. However, Representative Cullen and I are committed to ensuring that the State has plans in hand, ready to build when the time is right.


The Senate Special Committee on Procurement, of which I am a member, also met this month to go over possible areas of reform for the State Procurement Code. It is important that State agencies follow best practices to ensure that services are procured in an efficient and appropriate manner. We had an important discussion with the State Procurement Officer regarding issues such as delays due to bid protests, performance reviews, and change orders. Addressing such concerns to make improvements in agency processes remains one of our top priorities as we have seen the impact they have had throughout the pandemic.

We are heading into what is sure to be a busy holiday season, and I hope you feel as encouraged as I am knowing that we are making tremendous progress as a community. We are poised to be able to celebrate a brighter, more hopeful end to 2021. As we celebrate the last few months of this year I urge you to stay safe and healthy and to consider receiving both your COVID booster shot (if you are eligible), as well as your annual flu shot. #### OCTOBER PHONE UPDATES

Starting Oct. 24th, local calls dialed in Hawai'i will require the 808 area code in order for calls to go through. The change is due to a new FCC order adopting "988" as the code to reach the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline (NPSL.) If you dial a 988 number without dialing 808, you will reach the NSPL, so be sure to dial 808 + phone number from now on when making local calls!
