Comments:

I am in strong support of the confirmation of Matt Lyum to the Advisory Committee on Pesticides.

Thank you.

(1) Why do you wish to be a member of the Advisory Committee on Pesticides?

As an active member of the Landscape Industry Council of Hawaii and owner of a landscaping firm with over 100 employees, I am well aware of the plethora of pesticides being applied into our environment on a daily basis. Hawaii is the ONLY state without a requirement for all commercial pesticide applicators to have required training. Our workforce must be trained and guided to protect the environment, the worker, and the general public.

(2) How do you perceive the role and responsibilities of a member of the Advisory Committee on Pesticides?

To make responsible decisions on pesticide use that are in the best interest of the environment, the worker, and the general public.

(3) Given your understanding of the role and responsibilities of a member of the Advisory Committee on Pesticides, why do you believe that you are qualified for the position? Please include a brief statement of your skills, expertise, or knowledge that would aid in your decision-making ability as a member of the Advisory Committee on Pesticides.

I have a Bachelor's of Science in Fisheries Biology from the University of Washington, so I understand the impact of chemicals and run-off can have on the environment. I have the Hawaii license to manufacture Filtrexx siltsoxx so contractors can prevent sediment, oil, and other pollutants from going into our receiving waters. I hold a Restricted Use Pesticide License which trains me on proper use, handling, storage, and effect of pesticides. I passed the National Association of Landscape Contractors "Certified Landscape Professional" Exam. I am former President of the Waikalua Loko Fishpond Preservation Society which is dedicated to protecting Native Hawaiian Fishponds. I am former Board Member of the Landscape Industry Council of Hawaii. I founded Performance Landscapes in 2002 and grew it into an organization of over 100 employees, all of whom are trained in EPA Pesticide Handler/Worker protocol. I managed a composting/renewable energy company for 10 years so understand environmental responsibility.

(4) What do you hope to accomplish during your term of service?

To make sound decisions on the rules and policies of pesticide use for Hawaii.

(5) Name three qualities that best describe you and that would make you stand out. How would these qualities benefit the Advisory Committee on Pesticides?

Ethical – I am not swayed by special interest groups, money, or politics.

Environmental – I want to protect our environment for generations to come.

Pragmatic – As a successful business owner, I make practical decisions that can be carried out. As Thomas Edison stated, “Vision without execution is a hallucination.”

(6) Name one previous experience that would make you stand out. How would this benefit the Advisory Committee on Pesticides?

I was the Chair of The Landscape Industry Council of Hawaii’s Pesticide Certification Committee.

(7) Can you foresee any possible conflicts of interests that could arise during your service on the Advisory Committee on Pesticides? How would you overcome any possible conflicts of interest?

I meet with chemical distributors often due to my business. That could be perceived as a conflict. Safety, environmental concern, economics and practicality, are all factors in deciding what I purchase from these vendors. I will advise on policy decisions the same way.
