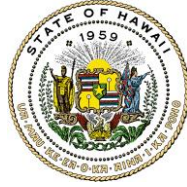

active duty military personnel who claim Hawaii as their residence of record.

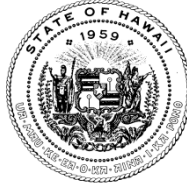
Since 2008, the late Congressman K. Mark Takai, championed this exemption for the Hawaii

I am Major General Kenneth Hara, Adjutant General, Director of the Hawaii Emergency Management Agency and Homeland Security Advisor.

The Department of Defense (DOD) provides written testimony in OPPOSITION to HB 290 HD1.

The proposal of HB 290 HD1 repeals Act 141 Session Laws of Hawaii 2008 on June 30, 2031.

Repealing this act will eliminate the exemption of the vehicle weight tax for one noncommercial motor vehicle for members of the National Guard, military reserve, or other active duty military personnel who claim Hawaii as their residence of record.

Since 2008, the late Congressman K. Mark Takai, championed this exemption for the Hawaii National Guard. This exemption has been an extremely important tool in the recruiting and retention of service members for the Hawaii Air and Army National Guard.

The Hawaii National Guard has been critical to the safety of Hawai'i and democracy of our nation. Floods, hurricanes, lava eruptions, a nation-wide COVID-19 pandemic, and security of our nation's capital required The Hawai'i National Guard to be ready for these challenges. We cannot exactly predict the extent of what climate change or manmade threats will affect Hawaii beyond 2031, however, we do know that despite the threats to Hawaii, The Hawaii National Guard will be there to protect its people from All Hazards. This exemption, provides respite to the demands that are placed on our Service Members and their families; allowing them an added benefit to make up for the sacrifices and selfless service they must make in order to keep Hawaii Safe.

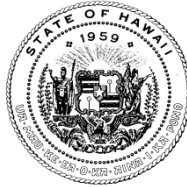

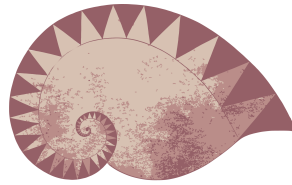

Aloha Chair and members of the committee,

The Pono Hawai'i Initiative (PHI) **supports HB290 HD1, Relating to Vehicle Weight Taxes. This measure removes the military exemption for the vehicle weight taxes.**

**Currently, military members stationed in Hawaii can receive an exemption to the vehicle weight tax. The system currently in place can be easily abused allowing more than one waiver to be obtained per military member. Military personal and their dependents use our State and County roads and contribute to their wear and tear, it makes rational sense that they should contribute to its upkeep.**

**Many states do not provide a similar waiver to military members. While stationed in Hawai'i, Active Duty members and their families receive a cost of living allowance to offset costs. One can assume that if the waiver is removed the cost of registering a vehicle will be calculated and added into this allowance paid to them.**

For these reasons, we urge the Committee to **vote in favor of HB290 HD1.**

SUBJECT: MOTOR VEHICLE, Repeal military exemption

BILL NUMBER: HB 290, HD1

INTRODUCED BY: House Committee on Corrections, Military, & Veterans

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: Repeals the military exemption for vehicle weight taxes on 6/30/2031.

SYNOPSIS: Amends Act 141, SLH 2008, by adding a sunset date of June 30, 2031.

EFFECTIVE DATE: 7/1/3050.

STAFF COMMENTS: The motor vehicle weight tax and registration fees are user charges designed to recover the cost of construction and maintenance of Hawaii's highway system. It should be remembered that all motorists use the state highways and should, therefore, lend a hand in paying for good and safe roads. Note well, that any exemption granted to a select group of users requires that the lost revenues be made up by those who must continue to pay. Motorists generally will have to pick up the additional costs created by this proposed exemption.

Exemptions based solely on physical condition or age represent poor tax policy. So, while the exemption would provide relief to a person in the military, a single mom making minimum wage, barely making ends meet, must continue to pay these fees. This bill, by repealing the exemption, could be seen as a step in the right direction.

Dear Representatives of the Corrections, Military, & Veterans Committee,

The Hawaii Commandery of the Military Order of Foreign Wars is pleased to provide testimony on the matter before the committee, HB290, considering the termination of the exemption for military personnel from the vehicle weight taxes.

The news that Governor David Y. Ige approval on July 2, 2019 of legislation (Act 188 HB601) allowing 100% disabled veterans to get a discount on their car registration was met with great support from across the Veteran Community in Hawaii. This act demonstrated that our elected leaders shared the same care for these Veterans, even though this exemption applied only to a very small number of Veterans, who met all three of the requirements for eligibility.

Likewise, the exemption for members of the National Guard, military reserve, or other active duty military personnel who claim Hawaii as their residence of record, demonstrated that same care for, and appreciation of service members who have been engaged in America's longest war against terrorism, and frequently employed in response to natural disasters.

If HB290 is passed, eliminating this exemption, then the House will send the opposite message, that our elected leaders do not value the sacrifices of its Citizens serving in the Armed Forces. The testimony submitted by the Adjutant General of Hawaii should be all that is necessary to convince you that this bill should be defeated, as he speaks on behalf of Hawaii's Veterans on this issue.

This bill repeals the military exemption for motor vehicle weight taxes which was enacted in 2008, at a time when the State was not facing a severe budget shortfall. However, with the current budget realities **it is important for the State to assess every tax measure for fairness and effectiveness at achieving larger policy goals.**

The current military exemption has several shortcomings from a tax fairness perspective:

- 1) **The current statute is overly broad**, and covers all military stationed in Hawai'i and their spouses when the **original intent was only for Hawai'i National guard and reserve members**. According to committee report 353-08 for Act 141 SL 2008 the purpose of the bill was:

“to recognize the dedication and service of members of **Hawaii's National Guard and Reserve forces** by exempting them from payment of vehicle taxes and registration fees.”<sup>1</sup>

Currently there are approximately 9,400 National Guard and Reserve forces in Hawai'i and there are 36,600 active duty military personnel.<sup>2</sup> A benefit which was meant to be targeted at Hawaii residents has largely gone to active duty military who are not permanent Hawai'i residents. The initial bill *did not* include all members of the armed services and that provision was added late in the process.

- 2) **Exempting all 36,000 military personnel and spouses increases the burden on local permanent residents to pay for roads and highways.**

When all active duty military members and their spouses are exempt from the vehicle weight tax, it does not reduce the costs needed to build and maintain our roads. It simply shifts the costs paid by the remaining Hawaii residents who are paying the vehicle motor weight tax.

**3) Eliminating this benefit will generate millions of dollars for Hawai'i roads and highways.**

The Department of Transportation has estimated that the state generated \$478,000 less in revenue as a result of this exemption in 2019.<sup>3</sup> This revenue represents only a half of the lost revenue because approximately 50% of the motor vehicle tax goes to the counties and the other 50% goes to the state. Furthermore, the department of transportation funding is usually matched with federal transportation funding to leverage a very high level of federal funding. The federal transportation dollar match could be as high as \$9 federal dollars for every \$1 state dollar.

For the above reasons, **the total amount of transportation funding gained by eliminating this tax is likely to be between \$2M and \$9M per year.**

**4) Active duty military members already enjoy significant benefits to reduce the cost of living in Hawai'i that are not available to non-military residents.** Offering further benefits to military members while local residents struggle to cover basic living costs is unfair and regressive. Military members receive a housing allowance; access to cheaper gas, food and household goods through stores on military bases; and a general cost of living adjustment (COLA) stipend. The military COLA benefit for Hawai'i service members ranges from \$1,800 to \$3,800 a year for a single a person, depending on rank.<sup>4</sup> Households with more members receive even larger benefits.

**Active-duty military members and their spouses are currently receiving thousands of dollars a year in benefits** while stationed in Hawai'i. It seems unnecessary to provide another benefit which shifts transportation costs to local non-military residents.

For the above reasons of addressing the state budget shortfall, honoring the bills original intent, leveraging federal transportation dollars, and tax fairness, we urge you to pass **HB290**.

I support the intent of HB290 and feel that it should move forward, however, the amount that will be garnered from a change in policy will be approximately \$478,000.00 as cited by HDOT in their testimony in support. It cost around 86,000,000.00 dollars for HDOT to maintain the state highway system, the state should look at all avenues including federal dollars from the FHWA, US DOT, and other agencies that can provide a larger magnitude of funds that can be used to support the state highway system.

In an advisory briefing with HDOT myself as a member of the CAC (Citizens Advisory Committee), HDOT gave a briefing on a proposed program to tax distance because persons using electric vehicles were not contributing to the fuel tax which directly supports the maintenance of our state highway system.

In this briefing, I ask the HDOT representative there what federal funds have we looked at which could offset persons using electric vehicles so that maybe the "distance would need to tax Hawaii residents especially those that have long commutes to work. I was surprised with the lack of creativity that the Department toward looking at every possible federal grant for which the state could qualify for that would be substantial and apply. As the legislature and having the "power of the purse," it would behoove the legislature to ask such questions so that substantial dollars can be accessed.

With the beginning of the new federal administration, I encourage the legislature to maintain oversight over HDOT and monitor their efforts toward attaining federal funds which in turn can be used for the betterment of our state. Passage of HB290 is would just be addressing a symptom larger institutional changes should be looked at as revenue dollars become scarcer. I would like to give my strong **OPPOSITION** against HB 290HD1. The proposal eliminates the exemption of the vehicle weight tax for one noncommercial motor vehicle for members of the National Guard, military Reserves, or other Active-Duty military personnel who claim Hawaii as their residence of record.

Department of Transportation (DOT) testimony in support of HB 290 claims a revenue reduction of \$478,000.00 because of the weight tax exemption. A review of the DOT website shows that the State's revenue intake from the weight tax is \$76,960,554.00 for 2020. So, this weight tax exemption in support of our troops, is a measly 0.006% of total weight tax revenues. Additionally, in the same DOT website, a review of Federal Highway funds sent to DOT over the past few years show millions of dollars unspent.

The late Representative (Congressman) K. Mark Takai and I worked very hard to obtain this exemption for our reserve troops, especially the Hawaii National Guard, to support their families as National and State missions increased over the years. I see that the recent use of the National Guard is the highest ever. Our commanders need every incentive to recruit and keep our troops. During the COVID19 pandemic, the Hawaii National Guard did not work remotely in safety. They showed up to rescue dysfunctional organizations like DLIR and DOH with organization and manpower to restore confidence in government. During the worldwide financial meltdown in 2008/2009, the legislature did not even consider eliminating the weight tax exemption for our troops as they searched for funds to make up the shortfall in State finances.

If HB 290HD1 passes, the message to our troops is this State does not care or appreciate the service and sacrifice of our military in Hawaii.

I am OPPOSED to HB 290HD1. The proposal eliminates the exemption of the vehicle weight tax for one noncommercial motor vehicle for members of the National Guard, military Reserves, or other Active-Duty military personnel who claim Hawaii as their residence of record.

Department of Transportation (DOT) testimony in support of HB 290 claims a revenue reduction of \$478,000.00 because of the weight tax exemption. A review of the DOT website shows that the State's revenue intake from the weight tax is \$76,960,554.00 for 2020. So, this weight tax exemption in support of our troops, is only 0.006% of total weight tax revenues.

The Department of Defense is the second largest contributor to the State of Hawaii's economy, and a vehicle weight tax exemption is a small contribution from the State to our individual Soldiers, Sailors, Airmen and Marines, whose families often must make significant sacrifices daily.
