A brief description of the applicant's background;

The Hawaii Law Enforcement Memorial began as a dream of the family members of Bryant Bayne, a Honolulu Police Department SWAT officer, who along with Tate Kahakai, another HPD SWAT officer, and Peter Crown, a Honolulu Fire Department firefighter/pilot, were killed in the line of duty. All three perished after their helicopter crashed while attempting to rescue lost hikers in Sacred Falls, Hauula, Hawaii. In February 2010, the Hawaii Law Enforcement Memorial Foundation was established and later Hawaii State Legislature adopted a measure supporting the construction, and maintenance of a law enforcement memorial. In April of 2010, HCR 139 was passed by the Hawaii Legislature paving the way for a perpetual Memorial. The Memorial is a collaboration of the Foundation, the state Department of Accounting and General Services (DAGS), the four county police departments, the Department of Public Safety (DPS), the U.S. Marshal, SHOPO, and the Concerns of Police Survivors (COPS).

In 2011, House Bill 1622, a follow-up measure to HCR 139, was signed into law directing that a law enforcement memorial be built within the capitol district grounds. A non-profit charitable organization, the Hawaii Law Enforcement Memorial Foundation was established to support the memorial and to conduct an annual ceremony honoring Hawaii's fallen law enforcement officers and their families.

2. The goals and objectives related to the request;

The Hawaii Law Enforcement Memorial has sustained water damage and has been periodically defaced by vandals. The indigenous plants that were so carefully tended have been replaced by naked dirt and irrigation pipes due to a disconnection with the DAGs water source. The Foundation board members have diligently conducted maintenance and support for the memorial, carefully tending to it, replacing the flags, paying for the marble plaques, and conducting an Annual Memorial Ceremony. However, due to the impacts of COVID19, fundraising opportunities have been limited and the organization's largest annual fundraiser the "Race to the Base" has been suspended for two years. The goal of this one-time grant is to assist in the operations necessary to maintain the memorial. These operations include repairs to the surface of the memorial, landscaping, and cleaning and are not to the underlying foundation.

3. The public purpose and need to be served:

Support and recognition of Hawaii's fallen law enforcement officers is critically important to a community confronted with public safety challenges and the grief associated with the ultimate sacrifice.

The statewide public, members of the law enforcement community, as well as the families of the fallen officers will be served by this request.

All of the above tasks will be overseen and managed by the 100% volunteer leaders of the Foundation with the assistance of contractors and partially paid by the Foundation's fundraising efforts and the contribution of in-kind donated services.

The repairs and restoration of the memorial are projected to be completed by March 1, 2023.

All of the repair and restoration tasks will be overseen and managed by the 100% volunteer leaders of the Foundation who will monitor the contractors.
