

Kahului Hongwanji Preschool (KHP) GiA Application:

1. Certification section 3: Public Purpose

KHP provides much need childcare and education serices to young children of working families in the Maui community. Kahului Hongwanji Mission, in addition to providing Buddhist services and education, conducts public activites on its campus and makes its facilities available for a variety of community actvities, as well as cultrual, physicla education and language classes. We also serve seniors with social and cultural activities and gatherings as well as meals.

II BACKGROUND AND SUMMARY

1. Applicant's Background

KHP has provided continuous quality childcare and education in Central Maui since 1975. We not only prepare children for their years in school to come, we provide moral support to families, and help them learn to manage their children using positive guidance methods. Kahului Hongwanji Mission, in addition to providing Buddhist services and education, makes its facilities available for a variety of community activities, as well as cultural, physical education and language classes. We also serve seniors with social and cultural activities/gatherings as well as meals.

2. Goals and Objectives Related to Request

KHP is located on the KHM campus, 291 S. Pu'unene Avenue, approximately 100 feet mauka of the Central Maui flood inundation zone boundary (Wakea Avenue). Since 2013 KHP has endured frequent incidences of flooding, three of which have required school closure, hazardous materials clean-up and replacement of flooring, etc. at significant expense.

Aldon Mochida, an contracting civil engineer has been retained to identify and carry out flood mitigation measures. These include, significant regrading in various areas of the KHM campus, and installation of subsurface drainage in two locations as well as a more powerful sump and rerouting of sump pump effluent to the A& B ditch adjoining the campus.

The larger sump pump requires an electricity upgrade to the KHP building, which requires a County of Maui permit. This presents a challenge, as the County will not permit KHM/KHP to undertake significant construction, or related projects until we install a fire hydrant to protect all the nearby structures. We do not have bids for the current cost of installing a fire hydrant, Therefore, this initial application is only for partial completion of the entire scope of work necessary to prevent further flooding.

3. Public Purpose

KHP provides a much needed service to young children of working families. KHM provides a variety of services to the local community as detailed above.

4. Target Population

Local working families (primarily) as well as the larger local Maui community, including senior citizens and individuals interested in Asian culture, language, etc.

5. Geographic Coverage

The island of Maui, primarily Central, South, UpCountry and East Maui.

III. SERVICE SUMMARY AND OUTCOMES

1. Scope of Work, Tasks and Responsibilities

As described above, Aldon Mochida, a contracting civil engineer will address the flooding three ways. He will grade various areas of the campus to improve water flow to the neighboring A& B ditch, install subsurface draining in 2 locations, as well as install and reroute the effluent of a more powerful sump pump than the one currently in use at KHP.

2. Annual Timeline

All work except that requiring County permitting (sump pump installation and rerouting) is expected to be completed by July 31, 2022.

3. Quality Assurance and Evaluation

KHP will easily be able to assure quality and evaluate the outcome of the project when the first heavy rain following completion of the work occurs. We expect no or minimal flooding and extensive water flow from several areas of the KHM campus to the adjoining A&B ditch.

4. Measures of Effectiveness

KHP will not flood when heavy rains fall, and there will be extensive water flow to the neighboring A&B ditch.

V. Experience and Capability

1. Necessary Skills and Experience

KHP has executed a several repair and improvement contracts over te last 10 years, including installation of new sewer drainage pipes and clean out to replacing rotting and non-existent infrastructure 2021 and on going. Extensive remodeling, and repair of Ministers home in 201202013. Significant repairs to crumbling concrete structures including temple and social hall walls, replacement of flooring in 3 buildings, carpeting in the KHM temple and KHP.

2. Facilities

KHP is part of a 3 facility building that includes the temple office, the indoor KHP classrooms and Directors office, and a all-purpose room used for many of our public outreach activities. The campus includes several other structures: a) the temple building, 2) a multi-purpose social hall with multi-stall bathrooms 3 kitchen facilities, a meeting/dining hall and various storage areas, 3) a 2,100 square foot minister's residence and garage, 4 equipment and other storage buildings, as well as the fenced KHP playground and equipment.

VI. Personnel Organization and Staffing
