3. Public Purpose

The funding will be used for a public purpose pursuant to Section 42F-102, Hawaii Revised Statutes. The museum will be open to the public.

II. Background and Summary

A brief description of the applicant's background;

The Inspiration Hawaii Museum is a new museum scheduled to open to the public in Fall 2022. The hiring of pre-opening staff begins in October 2022, three months after the July 1, 2022, start of the State's 2023 fiscal year.

The concept for this museum originated with Hawaii residents in 2015. The museum was included in the City's Halawa Rail Station Transit Oriented Development Final Plan published in July 2017. During 2019-2020, the museum assembled an impressive board of advisors. In March 2021, the Inspiration Hawaii Museum was granted Federal IRS tax exempt status 501(c) (3).

Due to delays with Rail, and delays in the development surrounding Aloha Stadium, the Inspiration Hawaii Museum decided to proceed with a temporary 3-year "Pop up" Museum in **downtown Honolulu.** A suitable building has been located and the museum plans to occupy the lobby level and open in fall 2022.







The museum's goal is to create a 50-50 partnership with the State of Hawaii.

50% from Private funding with 50% from State Government.

\$250,000 from Private matched with \$250,000 grant from State government, for total \$500,000.

3. The public purpose and need to be served;

People from Hawaii are only seen by the rest of the world through the lens of Hollywood stereotypes. Compiled in one place, our exhibits tell the stories of remarkable people from Hawaii who made an impact on the world.

4. Describe the target population to be served; and

Museum's primary target are Hawaii residents and families. We have special school tours designed for students of all ages. Other targets include tourists and new transplants.

Describe the geographic coverage.

The museum will attract people on Oahu. The Museum is near the State Capitol, City Hall and Iolani Palace. The Museum's website will expand coverage to include teachers and students on the neighbor islands.

III. Service Summary and Outcomes

1. Describe the scope of work, task and responsibilities;

The majority of work to design and build museum exhibits will occur during the summer of 2022 and will be paid for by private donations. State funding will go towards hiring museum staff who will operate the museum when it opens to the public in fall 2022.

Staff to maintain and improve exhibits, staff to guide tours and answer questions about the exhibits, staff for the bookstore, staff for maintenance, cleaning, and covid safety.

The Operations Manager and Deputy will manage staff, measure visitor satisfaction, increase book sales and oversee the museum's day-to-day operations.

Grand Opening - November 2022

Holiday promotion to visit new attraction.

April 1, 2023 – Programs for Tour groups designed with a marketing campaign.

July 1, 2023 – Programs for office workers downtown.

Oct 1, 2023 – add new exhibits for one year anniversary.

Board Members

Tim Johns past president and CEO of Bishop Museum, President and CEO Zephyr Insurance, board of directors for Hawaiian Electric Company, Parker Ranch, Polynesian Voyaging Society.

Lance Wilhelm past Chairman of Kamehameha Schools and current trustee. He is the founder and President of the Wilhelm Group. He serves on the board for Hawaii Pacific University.

Myles Shibata was Vice President Philanthropic Services at Hawaii Community Foundation for 12 years. He was the COO of Kawailoa Development owners of the Grand Hyatt Resort on Kauai. He is the in-coming Chair of the Board of the Honolulu Japanese Chamber of Commerce, and he currently consults businesses to improve operations.

Michael Carroll is Treasurer for the museum and a partner at the Honolulu law firm Bays, Lung, Rose, Voss.

Melanie Ide is a museum advisor. She is currently the president and CEO of Bishop Museum. Previously she worked for 27 years at Ralph Applebaum Associates a top international museum design firm in New York City. Her projects included museums at the Smithsonian Institute in Washington DC, the Obama Presidential Center in Chicago, the Clinton Presidential Library in Arkansas, and the American Museum of Natural History in New York. She was responsible for restoring and reinterpreting the Bishop Museum's Hawaiian Hall and Pacific Hall.

Pili Lee Loy is an education advisor. She was a teacher for 46 years at Aliamanu Middle school and served as Chairman at the Employee's Retirement System of Hawaii as the Trustee for Teachers. She is a trustee of the Hawaii Education Association and serves on the board of the King Kamehameha Judiciary History Center.

Gloria Borland is the museum founder. She was a media entrepreneur in Washington DC, creating and producing a TV series that aired on 150 PBS stations nationwide, her show was underwritten by *The Wall Street Journal*. She founded and launched a cable TV channel, published magazines, and founded a charter school. She worked for *The Legal Times* newspaper and early in her career she worked for U.S. Senator Daniel K. Inouye.

2. Facilities



We found a building that is an ideal location for placement of our exhibits. The building's location is in downtown Honolulu. More details will be announced in the 2nd quarter of 2022. Exhibits will be designed and built in the 3rd quarter and the museum will open to the public in the 4th quarter 2022.

VI. Personnel: Project Organization and Staffing

1. Proposed Staffing, Staff Qualifications, Supervision and Training

The Operations Manager will be hired in the 3rd quarter, with a salary paid from private donations for the first 6 months and funding from the State grant will pay for the last 6 months of the Operations Manager's yearly salary. The Deputy and other museum staff will be hired in the 4th quarter when the museum opens, with their salaries paid from the State grant.

3. Compensation

The three highest paid employees of the organization are: Operations Manager \$55,000, Deputy Operations \$40,000, and Staff \$30,000.

VII. Other

2. Licensure or Accreditation

The Inspiration Hawaii Museum, Inc. is a member of the Hawaii Museums Association.

3. Private Educational Institutions

The Inspiration Hawaii Museum, Inc. will not use the grant to support or benefit a non-sectarian private educational institution.

4. Future Sustainability Plan

The Inspiration Hawaii Museum will use State funding received during fiscal year 2023 as necessary seed money to launch and grow our new museum. Future sustainability is anticipated from entrance fees, gift shop revenues and private grants that will be part of the core resources to sustain the museum thereafter.
