The upgrade program initiated by the grant will focus on improving two areas: the Architectural and Exhibit Space and The Event and Creative Space.

Programs are as follows:

### Architectural and Exhibit Space

### Interior Architectural Lighting Retrofit

Allow the venue to achieve a coherent look and feel, upgrading to a level of finish that is on par with the standards of global museums and professional exhibit spaces. Rendering will be made smooth and consistent, accurately revealing the intent of an artist's objects and works and the presentation of the space will be outfitted with discrete, modern, timeless hardware.

### Upgrade Rigging

This upgrade will allow for increased diversity in the displays, exhibits and performances that can be presented in the space

### **Event and Creative Space**

### Controls

Implement a lighting control platform that can easily control the systems of the event and architectural space while have the capability to expand to meet the needs of multimedia artists and theatrical producers for world class productions and exhibits, as well as provide a training ground for local technical designers and technicians to hone their skills for careers in the performing and visual arts.

### **Fixtures**

Provide a package of automated lighting fixtures which brings the space to life through precise control of color, intensity and position allowing, for scene setting and mood generation for all types of installations, performances, and presentations.

### **Projection**

Upgrade the projection systems in the venue with an 8500 lumen projector and a retractable screen which will create a better presentation platform and increased revenue stream.

#### Network

Upgrade the network capability of the venue to accommodate the new technology implemented above and work to future proof by providing a platform which can accommodate the needs of artists and producers and our future endeavors.

The target date for primary installation is July – August 2022. Testing and any adjustments to the system will be completed by October 2022. We hope to begin training, classes, and implementation for public use before the end of 2022. By January 2023, we will have a fully functional, safe and technologically advanced upgraded system in both our gallery and performance spaces to be used by all artists and technicians in the community. We will also be able to launch our intern training program to create more affluent lighting designers and technicians in Honolulu.

We will be able to measure our success by the increased capacity, and through attendance of our training programs. As the grant will also be reducing our energy usage through more energy efficient equipment, we hope to see a 20% decrease in electricity usage over time.

The ARTS at Marks Garage is not currently involved in any pending litigation. We are also not awaiting any outstanding judgement.

While The ARTS at Marks Garage does not hold specific licensure or accreditation relevant to this project, we will be using licensed electrical contractors for the installation.

We are not using this grant to support or benefit any private institution directly, although we do not restrict usage of the facilities to any organization. As an inclusive organization we hope that all can benefit from this much needed upgrade.

Once the equipment is installed and operational, the benefit beyond FY23 is capacity, usage, and energy efficiency. In order maintain the equipment over time, we plan to charge a fee for usage for individuals and/or organizations who utilize the equipment for their events. The cost of replacing equipment will be included, unless significant damage or use justifies the need to apply for additional funding for replacement.

It is anticipated that equipment will likely need to be replaced within 7-10 years to keep up with the advancement of technology, and to ensure that the equipment is running efficiently.
