## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO REPORTS FILED WITH THE CAMPAIGN SPENDING COMMISSION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 11-334, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 3 The candidate and treasurer of the candidate "(a) 4 committee of each candidate whose name will appear on the ballot 5 shall file preliminary, final, and supplemental reports as 6 follows: 7 (1)The filing dates for preliminary reports are: 8 (A) April 30 of the year of a general election; 9 Thirty calendar days before a primary, initial (B) 10 special, or initial nonpartisan election; 11 (C) Ten calendar days before a primary, initial 12 special, or initial nonpartisan election; 13 October 1 of the year of a general election; and (D) 14 (E) Ten calendar days before a general, subsequent 15 special, or subsequent nonpartisan election; 16 [provided that this preliminary report does not 17 need to be filed by a candidate who is

| 20 | (3) | The filing date for the final election period report   |
| 21 |     | is thirty calendar days after a general, subsequent,   |

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1 subsequent special, or subsequent nonpartisan 2 election. The report shall be current through the day 3 of the applicable election. The final election period report shall be filed by a candidate who is 4 5 unsuccessful in a primary, initial special, or initial nonpartisan election or a candidate who is elected to 6 7 office in the primary, initial special, or initial 8 nonpartisan election; provided that a candidate who is 9 elected and is to be sworn into office [prior to] 10 before thirty calendar days after a general, 11 subsequent, subsequent special, or subsequent 12 nonpartisan election in which the candidate was 13 elected, shall file the final election period report 14 three business days before the date the candidate is 15 to be sworn into office; and 16 (4) The filing dates for supplemental reports are: 17 (A) January 31 annually; and 18 (B) July 31 after an election year. 19 The report shall be current through December 31 for 20 the report filed on January 31 and current through 21 June 30 for the report filed on July 31."

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SECTION 2. Section 11-339, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 amended by amending subsections (b) and (c) to read as follows: 2 "(b) By June 30 of an election year, a candidate committee 3 4 that does not intend to receive contributions [, or] and make 5 expenditures  $[\tau]$  that aggregate more than \$1,000 in an election 6 period shall notify the commission of its intent in the 7 candidate committee's organizational report. 8 (c) By the fifth calendar day before the due date of the 9 preliminary primary report  $[\tau]$  that is due ten days before the election, a noncandidate committee that does not intend to 10 receive contributions [7 - or] and make expenditures [7] that 11 aggregate more than \$1,000 in an election period shall notify 12

13 the commission of its intent in the noncandidate committee's organizational report." 14

15 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 16

17 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval. 18
