BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

Ţ	SECTION 1. Section 266-2.3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	repealed.		
3	[" [\$266-2.3] Kewalo basin use permit; Honolulu harbor use
