A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WITNESS FEES AND REIMBURSEMENTS IN CRIMINAL CASES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 621-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 amended to read as follows: 2 "§621-7 Fees; criminal cases. (a) [Every] Except as 3 provided in subsection (c), every witness legally required to 4 attend a state court or grand jury in any criminal case, other 5 than a public officer or employee, shall be entitled to \$20 for 6 each day's attendance and a reasonable mileage fee to be 7 established pursuant to rules adopted by the judiciary for each 8 mile actually and necessarily traveled on the ground each way, 9 10 including travel to and from the nearest airport when required to travel from another island or from outside the State. 11 In addition to witness' fees, every witness[+] who attends 12 a state court from: 13 [Who attends a state court from outside] Outside the 14 (1) State shall be entitled to the actual round-trip cost 15 of plane travel, plus [\$200] \$250 per twenty-four-hour 16 17 day; or

1	(2) [who accords a scare court from any] Any Island in the
2	State other than that on which the court holds session
3	shall be entitled to the actual round-trip cost of
4	plane travel, plus \$55 per twenty-four-hour day;
5	provided that when the witness is required to stay
6	overnight, the witness shall be entitled to an
7	additional [\$145] \$195 per twenty-four-hour day.
8	[These] Any per diem [payments] payment made pursuant to this
9	<u>subsection</u> shall cover all personal expenses, [such as]
10	including board and lodging, and shall be computed on the basis
11	of [quarter day] quarter-day periods of time.
12	(b) Any police officer or other public officer or employee
13	(except the county attorney, prosecuting attorney, or deputy
14	county attorney or deputy prosecuting attorney), who attends a
15	state court as a witness from a district other than that in
16	which the court is holding session, shall be allowed the police
17	officer's, public officer's, or <u>public</u> employee's travel cost
18	and mileage fees as provided in this section. A public officer
19	or employee, if not salaried, shall receive witness fees.
20	(c) Every expert witness legally required to attend a
21	state court or grand jury in any griminal case, other than a

1	public of	ficer or employee, shall be entitled to reasonable
2	applicabl	e fees for the testimony, consultation, and preparation
3	associate	d with the expert witness' testimony and attendance in
4	court.	
5	In a	ddition, every expert witness who attends a state court
6	from:	
7	(1)	Outside the State shall be entitled to the actual
8		round-trip cost of plane travel, plus \$250 per twenty-
9		four-hour day; or
10	(2)	Any island in the State other than that on which the
11		court holds session shall be entitled to the actual
12		round-trip cost of plane travel, plus \$55 per twenty-
13		four-hour day; provided that when the expert witness
14		is required to stay overnight, the expert witness
15		shall be entitled to an additional \$195 per twenty-
16		four-hour day.
17	Any per d	iem payment made pursuant to this subsection shall
18	cover all	personal expenses, including board and lodging, and
19	shall be	computed on the basis of quarter-day periods of time.
20	(d)	As used in this section, "expert witness" includes any
21	witness s	subpoenaed on behalf of the State in a criminal case, or

- 1 on behalf of a defendant at the expense of the State in a
- 2 criminal case, who is subpoenaed for the witness' specialized
- 3 knowledge, skill, experience, training, or education to assist a
- 4 grand jury, trial jury, or judge to understand the evidence or
- 5 determine a fact at issue in the case."
- 6 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
