A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MAIL THEFT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the ongoing
- coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic has changed the way 2
- 3 many families rely on delivery services. There has been a major
- 4 increase in the amount of online orders being placed, and
- 5 subsequently fulfilled by shipping items through the mail.
- 6 packages sent through the mail are left outside the door at
- 7 their intended destination if there is no mail receptacle large
- 8 enough for the package on site.
- 9 The legislature further finds that reports of mail theft
- 10 are on the rise. When mail carriers leave packages by doors or
- 11 in otherwise unsecured mail receptacles, the packages are
- 12 susceptible to theft, leading to frustration from senders and
- 13 intended recipients.
- 14 The purpose of this Act is to establish the criminal
- offense of theft of mail. 15

1	SECTION 2. Chapter 708, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to part IV to be appropriately
3	designated and to read as follows:
4	"§708- Theft of mail. (1) A person commits the offense
5	of theft of mail if the person intentionally obtains or exerts
6	unauthorized control over mail from another person's mailbox or
7	premises without the effective consent of the addressee and with
8	the intent to deprive that addressee of the mail.
9	(2) For purposes of this section, "mail" means an
0	envelope, a package, a bag, or a box that:
1	(a) Is delivered by a common carrier or delivery service
2	to an addressee; or
3	(b) Has been left to be collected for delivery by a common
14	carrier or delivery service.
15	(3) Theft of mail is a misdemeanor."
16	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
17	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
