ACT 179 S.B. NO. 3284 S.D. 2 H.D. 2 C.D. 1

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that large organizations
- 2 like the State of Hawaii could benefit from consolidating
- 3 information technology services to gain economies of scale and
- 4 provide for a more efficient and secure use of technology and
- 5 information management. The consolidation of information
- 6 technology services will also help to ensure that the State
- 7 remains in compliance with growing regulatory requirements for
- 8 accessibility, information storage, data sharing, and security,
- 9 especially in light of recent high-profile attacks on government
- 10 computer systems by hackers.
- Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish a
- 12 working group to develop a plan for the phased consolidation of
- 13 information technology services and staff within executive
- 14 branch agencies in a five-year timespan, excluding the
- 15 department of education, Hawaii health systems corporation,
- 16 University of Hawaii, and office of Hawaiian affairs.
- 17 SECTION 2. (a) There is established a technology services
- 18 consolidation working group, that shall:

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•	(1)	Deve	top a plan for the phased consolidation of all
2		stat	e executive branch information technology services
3		and	staff, where determined practicable by the working
4		grou	p, within five years, excluding the department of
5		educ	ation, Hawaii health systems corporation,
6		Univ	ersity of Hawaii, and office of Hawaiian affairs,
7		unde	r the office of enterprise technology services.
8		The	plan shall include:
9		(A)	An identification of the specific positions and
10			functions to be transferred in each department;
11		(B)	Proposed dates of transfer for each position and
12			function;
13		(C)	Proposed information technology facility,
14			personnel, and operational infrastructure needs
15			of the consolidated information technology
16			agency, with projections on future integration
17			needs as additional agencies' information
18			technology staff and services are added;
19		(D)	Recommendations to enable the office of
20			enterprise technology services to provide expert
21			support to all state agencies regarding

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1		information technology activities in order to
2		meet the needs of the agencies and the public;
3		and
4		(E) Recommendations to ensure that agency services
5		are not interrupted during the phased
6		consolidation; and
7	(2)	Make recommendations to attract high-quality
8		information technology professionals to the State,
9		including the use of internships, and assess the
10		feasibility of exempting certain positions from the
11		requirements of chapters 76 and 89, Hawaii Revised
12		Statutes.
13	(b)	Members of the working group shall include:
14	(1)	The chief information officer, who shall serve as
15		chairperson;
16	(2)	The single executive or the chairperson of the
17		executive board, as the case may be, of each principal
18		executive branch department or that person's designee,
19		excluding the department of education, Hawaii health
20		systems corporation, University of Hawaii, and office
21		of Hawaiian affairs; and

1	(3) Any other person that the chief information officer				
2	wishes to invite to serve on the working group.				
3	(c) The working group shall be administratively attached				
4	to the department of accounting and general services. The				
5	office of enterprise technology services shall provide				
6	administrative support to the working group.				
7	(d) No later than twenty days prior to the convening of				
8	the regular session of 2023, the working group shall submit to				
9	the legislature a preliminary status report. This preliminary				
10	status report shall also include any findings, recommendations,				
11	proposed legislation, and funding requirements necessary for the				
12	completion of the plan for a phased consolidation of state				
13	information technology services.				
14	(e) No later than twenty days prior to the convening of				
15	the regular session of 2024, the working group shall submit to				
16	the legislature a report of its findings and recommendations,				
17	including:				
18	(1) The plan for a phased consolidation of state				
19	information technology services developed pursuant to				
20	subsection (a)(1), including a detailed five-year				

phase-in schedule;

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- 1 (2) Recommendations to attract high-quality information
 2 technology professionals to the State; and
 3 (3) Any proposed legislation.
 4 (f) The working group shall be dissolved on December 31,
 5 2023.
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
