A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION ANNUAL REPORT REQUIREMENTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to repeal certain
- 2 department of education annual reporting requirements that are
- 3 no longer necessary.
- 4 SECTION 2. Section 302A-431, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 5 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
- 6 "(b) The [department and the] University of Hawaii shall
- 7 submit a biennial report to the governor and the legislature
- 8 prior to the convening of each regular session in the first year
- 9 of each biennium that identifies the cost impacts to the State
- 10 of providing workers' compensation coverage for University of
- 11 Hawaii students [under sections 302A-430 and 302A-440]."
- 12 SECTION 3. Section 302A-1134, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 13 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
- "(b) Any child who, while attending school, is found to be
- 15 in possession of a firearm, shall be excluded from attending
- 16 school for not less than one year. The due process procedures
- 17 of chapter 19 of the Department of Education, Hawaii



- 1 Administrative Rules, shall apply to any child who, while
- 2 attending school, is alleged to be in possession of a firearm.
- 3 The superintendent, on a case-by-case basis, may modify the
- 4 exclusion of a child found to be in possession of a firearm
- 5 while attending school. If a child is excluded from attending
- 6 school, the superintendent shall ensure that substitute
- 7 educational activities or other appropriate assistance shall be
- 8 provided. [The superintendent shall submit to the United States
- 9 Department of Education, the state board of education, and the
- 10 legislature an annual report indicating the number of students
- 11 excluded, the types-of-firearms found in their possession, and
- 12 the schools from which they were excluded.] "
- SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 15 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
