A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR CLAIMS AGAINST THE STATE, ITS
OFFICERS, OR ITS EMPLOYEES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

PART I

SECTION 1. The following sums or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2021-2022 are appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii to the department of the attorney general for the purpose of satisfying claims for legislative relief as to the following named persons, firms, corporations, and entities, for claims against the State or its officers or employees for the overpayment of taxes, or for refunds, reimbursements, payments of judgments or settlements, or other liabilities, in the amounts set forth opposite their names:

15 SECTION 3. The sums hereinabove may be paid to the
16 respective persons, firms, corporations, or entities for the
17 satisfaction or settlement of the respectively identified cases,
18 and in several amounts hereinabove set forth or in lesser
19 amounts deemed appropriate, upon checks issued by the
20 comptroller; provided that departments shall obtain the approval
21 of the attorney general before payment of any claim may be made.

22 SECTION 4. Notwithstanding the sums hereinabove stated as
23 interest upon judgments against the State, payment of interest
24 shall be limited to the period from the date of judgment, if
25 applicable, to thirty days after the effective date of this Act,
26 as provided in section 662-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, for those
27 cases to which the statute applies.



1 SECTION 5. All unexpended and unencumbered balances of the
2 appropriations made in this Act as of the close of business on
3 June 30, 2023, shall lapse.

4 SECTION 6. If any provision of this Act, or the
5 application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held
6 invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
7 applications of the Act that can be given effect without the
8 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
9 of this Act are severable.

10 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
